Lake Forest, which won the Invitational Meet a week ago, will not be nearly so difficult in a meet where places do not count for as many points as in a large Invitational Meet.





Although the team has a somewhat pessimistic viewpoint towards their future possibilities it can be favorcessful teams of past years.


