

Alternate Entertainment: The Quiet Knight

Even if you've seen this week's UB flick, entertainment, which is at such a high premium around here, can still be found at a place called the Quiet Knight on 953 W. Belmont. You can take the State street rapid transit to Belmont and you'll be only steps away. Shows are at 9 and 11 pm on Wednesday thru Sunday with a special 12:30 am performance on Fridays and Saturdays. Prices aren't extravagant. With a student I.D. you can get in for

only \$1.00 on Wednesday or Thursday, all other times, \$3.00.

The fare at the Knight is mostly folk and blues and the effect is near ecstasy for anyone who can appreciate that kind of music. Shawn Phillips and Don McLean were there last week and although I wouldn't use the same superlatives I read in the Knight's promotion blurb, they were still easily worth the risk of riding the CTA. Both depended on guitar and vocals but there was little similarity beyond that. My only reserva-

tion about Don McLean was that his performance might have been a little too down pat and polished, whereas Shawn Phillips was more natural and spontaneous (or stoned) and had much better rapport with the audience. This week's star will be Dave Van Ronk followed by Merry Clayton, Nov. 17-21, and Ian and Sylvia, Nov. 24-28.

If you're of age (and you will be carded) and want to drink, you'll be seated closer to the stage and there's a two drink minimum. But it's a very low key atmosphere. The waitresses make themselves discreet during the sets and no money changes hands until you're ready to leave. The only drawback here is that everyone wants to leave at the same time, so if you're the impatient type this part of your evening could be fatal. If you can survive this though, you'll probably be back.

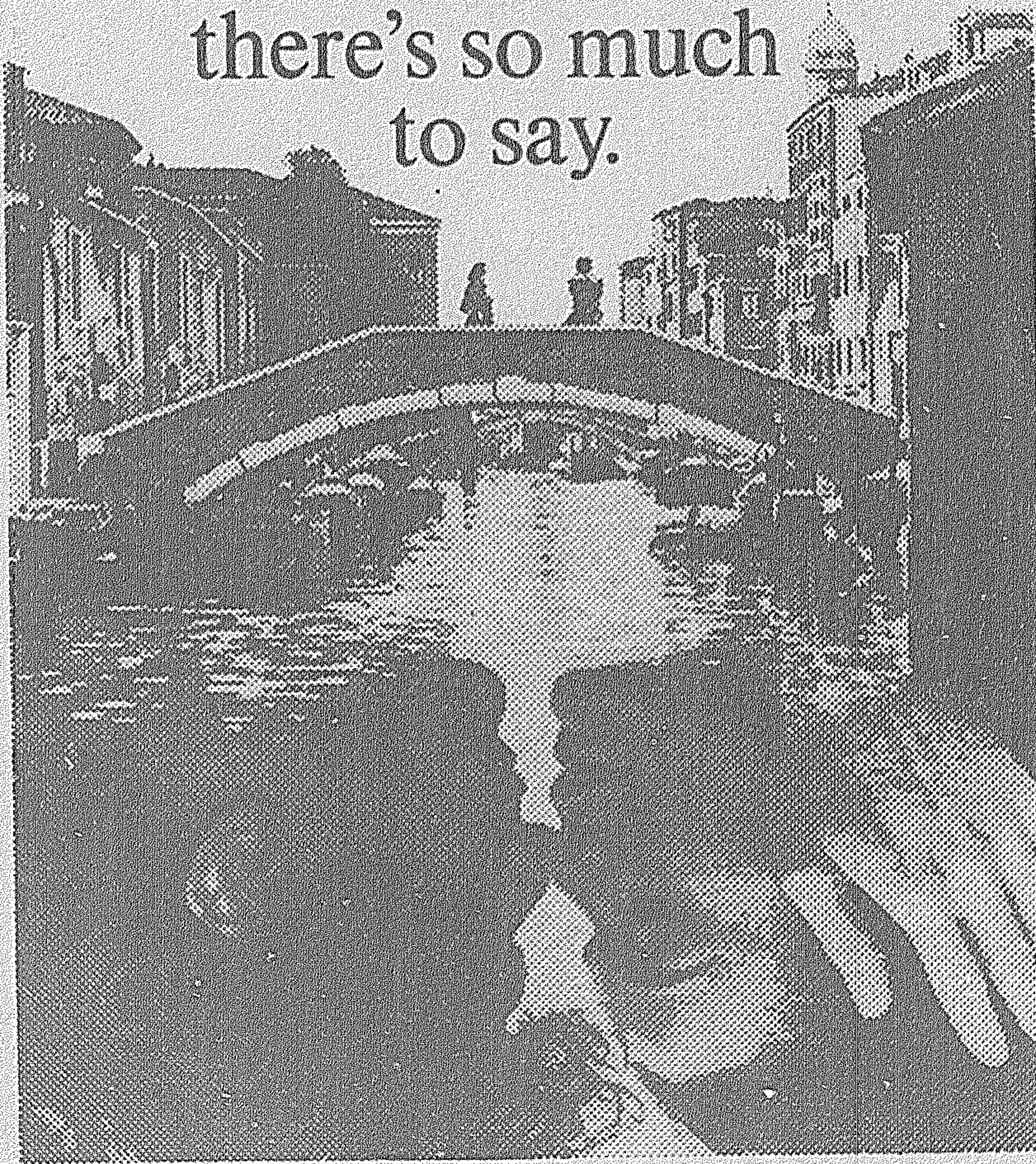
