

TECH BASEBALL TEAM TAKES FOURTH LEAGUE VICTORY BY DEFEATING LAKE FOREST 6-2

To Play Three League Games This Week;

The success of Junior Week was added to by the Armour Tech baseball team's participation in two home games at Ogden Field. The first game, played Wednesday, resulted in a league victory for the Tech squad, the fourth league win of the season. Although the second game was lost, it was a hard game to lose and was the second defeat at the hands of the strong Michigan State Normal team.

Beat Lake Forest 6-2

The Tech squad played good baseball to prove their superiority over the Lake Forest team by the tune of a 6-2 score. While holding the Lake Forest scoring until the fourth inning, the engineers took two runs when Evans hit a homer into left field scoring Sommer ahead of him. Two doubles over the right field fence gave Lake Forest a run in the fourth inning and Armour took back the run in the home half of the inning on two hits. The other Lake Forest run was scored in the fifth inning but the Tech men came back to make the victory decisive in the seventh inning by counting three runs on four hits to make the final score 6 to 2.

A return game with the Lake Forest aggregation will probably be arranged for May 25 at Lake Forest, since the first game was postponed on account of rain. This will be the last game of the season for the Tech team, and by that time, the league championship should be decided.

Loss to Michigan State Normal

On Tuesday, the Tech men lost a hard-fought game to Michigan State Normal of Ypsilanti by a score of 9 to 7. Both teams scored a run in the second inning, but Michigan came back strongly in the next two frames to lead at the end of the fourth by a 6 to 1 score. Armour retaliated with one run in the fifth and two more in the sixth, but three runs in the seventh gave Michigan a five run lead. The Tech men refused to give up, however, and in the last two innings staged a rally that was meant to produce victory, but fell short by two runs to make the final score 9 to 7. The three runs were scored in the eighth inning by virtue of two bases on balls followed by two hits and an error. The ninth inning was scoreless for both teams.
