

# TECH SQUAD WINS TRACK MEET AT NEW FIELD HOUSE

## Defeats Chicago "B" and La Grange Track Teams

SCORES 57½ POINTS

By winning nine firsts and nine places, the Armour track men amassed a total of 57½ points last Tuesday evening, to win a triangular indoor track meet at the U. of C. fieldhouse with LaGrange Junior College and Chicago University B team. LaGrange was second in total points with 43½ points and the Chicago University B team trailed with 22 points.

Individual high point honors of the meet, as usual, went to George Nelson of Armour, who scored 19 points by winning the low and high hurdles, broad jump, tying for first in high jump, and running anchor on the relay team. Sademan and Lind ran fast races in the mile and half mile respectively.

DePauw defeated the Armour swimming team last Friday by a score of 46 to 29. The first event of the evening was the 160 yard relay won by DePauw in a time of 1:23.6. Cavanagh of Armour took the 200 yard breast-stroke with a ten yard lead over his team mate Kolve in a time of 3 minutes flat.

In the 100 yard back stroke, Bradley the only DePauw man entered defeated Weston and Bernstein by five yards in a time of 1:49.9. DuShane and Powell, both of DePauw finished ahead of Byanskas in the 40 yard dash by a very close margin.

The 200 yard free style was taken by two of the DePauw men in a hard fought battle with Davison who challenged their lead during the whole of the event. Edwards won in a time of 2:39. DuShane and Bradley, both of DePauw took first and second respectively over Ahern in the 100 yard free style race. The winner's time was 1:02.2.

Weston, Cavanagh, and Carlstrom of Armour defeated Pettet, Kreuke and Edward in the 300 yard medley relay in a time of 3:45.8. Final results of the fancy diving showed that Powell of DePauw was first, with Kolve and Jung of Armour second and third respectively.
