U. spring tourney and the Tech Relays. The date for the Armour Invitational meet has been set at March 24, and another successful get-together is expected. A trip to Bradley Tech at Peoria is also contemplated, and Coach Stagg is making arrangements to take the team to Notre Dame for the Central Intercollegiate meet.


