

ARMOUR DEFEATS LAKE FOREST IN FINAL BALL GAME

Eighth Inning Rally By Armour Decides Ball Game

Armour cinched second place in the Northern Intercollegiate Conference last Tuesday afternoon when they staged a five run rally in the eighth inning to defeat Lake Forest by the score of 7 to 5.

George Mayer, pitching his final game for the school, received credit for his seventh victory in eight starts. Drakeham, Lake Forest pitching ace, was the victim of that hectic eighth. Lake Forest jumped into a 2 to 1 lead in the fifth and added three more in the sixth to make things look very gloomy for the Engineers. During this time the visitors thumped Mayer for six solid blows while Drakeham was just breezing along.

The Techawks began to find Drakeham in the sixth when they picked up a run to make the score 5 to 2. The highlight of that "Frank Merriwell" eighth was Bartusek's single that scored the tying run.

Reed, another last year man that will be missed, was the despair of the entire Lake Forest infield, stealing four bases during the game. Other veterans that have played their last game for Armour are Capt. Vic Omiecinski, Morelli, Lillis, Mayer, and Lukas. Coach Kraft, who did a fine job with the team this year, will find it hard to replace these graduating ballplayers.

First Inning

L. F.—Loveton's hard grounder bounced over Lauchiskis's head for a base hit. Parsons laid down a sacrifice bunt, moving Loveton to second. On a play at second, Bartusek threw the ball into center field, Loveton going to third. Bade drew a pass. Bade went to second, no play being made on him. Dohr struck out. Drakeham walked filling the bases. Mayer tossed out Schroeder.

A.—Reed singled to left field. Schroeder tried to make a shoe-string catch but could not hold on to the ball. Reed stole second. Lillis took a third strike. V. Omiecinski flied out to Fuchs in right center. Gruendel tossed out T. Omiecinski.

Second Inning

L. F.—Hubley fouled out to T. Omiecinski. Gruendel struck out. So did Fuchs.

A.—Mayer poked a Texas-league single behind second. On a hit-and-run play, Mayer was trapped between first and second base when Adamec failed to connect. Dohr making the putout. Adamec walked. Lauchiskis hit into a fast double-play Gruendel to Hubley to Dohr.

Third Inning

L. F.—Loveton doubled over the right field fence. Parsons flied deep to Reed, Loveton going to third on the catch. Bade got a two-bagger over the right field fence, scoring Loveton. T. Omiecinski lost Dohr's high foul fly behind first. Dohr drove a hard two-base hit to right center scoring Bade from second. Drakeham died swinging. Mayer threw out Schroeder.

A.—Bartusek lined to Gruendel. Biegler drew a pass. Reed forced second. Lillis walked. Reed stole third easily. On a double steal Reed scored and Lillis went all the way to third on the play at the plate. V. Omiecinski, fanned.

Fourth Inning

L. F.—Hubley grounded out to V. Omiecinski. T. Omiecinski beat Gruendel to the bag on his easy roller. Fuchs singled to left, Gruendel moving to second. Loveton forced Fuchs at second.

A.—T. Omiecinski was hit by a pitched ball. Mayer forced T. Omiecinski at second. Adamec fanned. Lauchiskis singled to left, Mayer stopping at second. Bartusek was tossed out by Drakeham.

Fifth Inning
L. F.—Parsons singled to left. Bade sacrificed Parsons to second. Dohr strolled. Drakeham also walked, filling the bases. Schroeder flied to Reed, Parsons scoring after the catch. Hubley reached first on an error by Lillis, Dohr scoring. On a triple steal Drakeham tallied but Schroeder was nailed at third.

A.—Biegler died swinging. Reed walked. Lillis attempted sacrifice forced Reed at second. Lillis was out stealing, Parsons to Gruendel.

Sixth Inning

L. F.—Mayer tossed out Gruendel. Fuchs grounded out to V. Omiecinski on a nice play. Loveton swung lustily at a third strike.

A.—V. Omiecinski walked. T. Omiecinski reached first on Gruendel's error. Mayer trapped to Drakeham, who failed to trap V. Omiecinski, filling the bases. Adamec forced Mayer. V. Omiecinski scoring, and T. Omiecinski taking third. Lauchiskis watched a third strike. Bartusek was also called out on strikes.

Seventh Inning

L. F.—Parsons lined to Adamec. Bade was thrown out by Lauchiskis. Dohr was easy for Reed.

A.—Biegler missed a third strike. Reed beat out hard hit to the shortstop. Reed was out trying to steal second. Lillis fanned.

Eighth Inning

L. F.—Drakeham doubled over the fence. Schroeder popped to Mayer. Biegler made a marvelous back-handed catch of Hubley's line-drive and stepped on second to double Drakeham over second.

A.—Hubley threw out V. Omiecinski. T. Omiecinski broke his bat singling to center. Mayer slammed a two-bagger over the fence sending Tad to third. Adamec tapped to

Loveton who pulled a "boner" when he threw to the plate, Tad holding third. Adamec reached first to load the bases. On a wild throw by Parsons, Tad scored and the runners moved up a base. Lauchiskis fanned. Bartusek singled sharply to left scoring Mayer and Adamec with the tying runs. Bartusek continued to second on the throw-in. Biegler grounded to Loveton whose poor throw escaped Dohr, Bartusek scoring. Biegler after reaching second, noticed that the whole Lake Forest infield was "up in the air," and continued around the bases to finally score while the visiting athletes were desperately trying to retrieve the ball somewhere in left field.

Ninth Inning

L. F.—Gruendel struck out. Fuchs lined a single to center field. Loveton watched a third strike float past. Lake went in to run for Fuchs. Lillis made a desperate try of Parsons's foul. Parsons rolled weakly to Mayer.

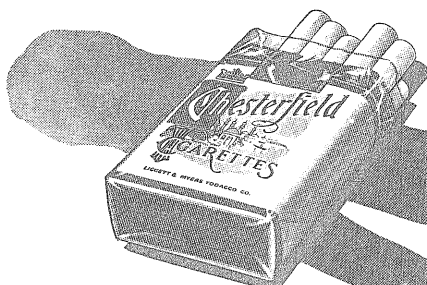
