

With the announcement of a completion of work under the new research foundation project, the science of photography has reached a new high. The project sponsored by a gift of \$6,735,000,000 by Elmer Slurp Esq. has just been completed after seven years' intensive study. With the development of new films and the grinding of seventeen new lenses the camera was placed in a light proof building mounted on bed springs with four feather beds as part of the springing. Seven feet of cork placed in 11/2 inch layers painted black on both sides were used in the walls and floors of the building. The Inside of a Sulfur Barrel.


