SigEp's ideal is "the Balanced Man" and when you visit the SigEp Fraternity you will find a chapter of balanced men. The national fraternity started in 1901 was founded on the idea that "this fraternity will be different" and quickly grew to be the largest fraternity in the country. SigEp was the first fraternity to charter a chapter in all 50 states, and the first to build an endowment greater than \$11 million for our Educational Foundation. In 1948, SigEp came to IIT as IL Beta and has been here ever since. We believe that every member has the ability to be a scholar, a gentleman, and an athlete. Each member spends his few years as an active undergraduate SigEp at IIT lead by his older brothers to become a better scholar, gentleman, athlete, philanthropist, and leader through the fraternity ideals of virtue, diligence, and brotherly love.

At IIT you can find SigEps excelling in almost every major, in addition to ROTC, Varsity Sports, Student Government, Greek Council, and a variety of clubs, organizations, and internships across the country. Almost all 50 members live in the fraternity house on the quad, and spend most of the week studying, working, building, relaxing, and socializing together, meaning at any moment of the day you can find a brother to join you for a game, help you with a homework assignment, or talk with you about anything.

Every year Greek Council puts on a week of inter-greek competitions called

Greek Week where every fraternity and sorority on campus is tested physically and mentally; Since Greek Week began, SigEps have participated wholeheartedly, and for the last 5 years we have been declared the winners.



In general, Greek GPAs are higher than those of the rest of the school, as every fraternity holds their members to high standards of academic achievement, acknowledging our priorities to the university before the Fraternity. This last

semester, SigEps had the highest GPA of all Fraternities and a higher GPA than the all male average at the school.

For many years the SigEps have lacked in philanthropy, doing what they can with small events such as Blood Drives, fundraisers, Marathons, Haunted Houses, etc. However this year, SigEp is hosting a karaoke event to raise money for the B + Foundation, an organization dedicated to supporting terminally ill children. Already raising over \$500, the SigEps plan to make this an annual fraternity philanthropy on par with the Skulls' Sausage Fest and the PiKapp's Push America in an effort to raise our community service from hundreds of hours per semester, to hundreds of hours plus thousands of dollars donated each semester.

Being one of the larger fraternities on campus and the largest national fraternity, it is easy to imagine the alumni network that SigEp has to offer, and every year almost every member is sent to leadership conferences around the country to develop as a leader in our fraternity, our university, and our country. Being one of the first fraternities to be non-hazing, and the first fraternity to remove race and sexual orientation from membership requirements, SigEps have grown as a national and local fraternity by the principles of brotherly love, rather than abuse, making it the strong and powerful fraternity it is today.

TRIANGLE

On IIT's campus, Triangle members are involved in many on-campus organizations and activities, as well as having a great time with each other whenever we hang out. We do, however, always keep our academics in mind. We also host fun events during the school year too. Examples from this semester include Chicago Indoor Racing, Nerf Wars, and Laser Quest. Some of the philanthropic organizations that we are involved with, both on a national and local level, include Habitat for Humanity, Special Olympics, and volunteering with FIRST Robotics. Recently, some of our members have become very involved in Engineers Without Borders, serving on both executive board and project teams. A couple of our members have actually gone down to Haiti to work on the implementation of a project in the past couple of years. But this is only our chapter, one of many.

Triangle Fraternity is a social Fraternity of Engineers, Architects, and Scientists. We were founded in 1907 at the University of Illinois by a group of 16 Civil Engineers that were just planning on living together in the following year. But Triangle has evolved into much more than just a group of men living together. We now accept all types of

engineering majors, along with architects and members from the science community. Our chapters have grown very quickly to over 35 chapters nationwide, and we recently had our 25,000th man initiated into brotherhood. Triangle's mindset is summarized in our Code of Ethics (which can be found in its entirety on triangle.org), which every member of Triangle strives to maintain. Its main points include keeping our Ritual present in our everyday lives, creating an environment in which enduring friendships can be formed, keeping scholastics as a top priority, as well as putting forth an honest effort in accomplishing anything that you set your mind to. These values are what define a Triangle man. Regardless of background or current skill set, we are all striving for the same goals in life and we have each other to help reach those goals.
