

EXPANDING EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY

Illinois Institute of Technology brings to the greater Chicago area a significant advance in education for part-time students—a live, instructional television network that enables organizations to offer educational opportunities to their employees at their places of employment.

This network links classroom-studios on campus with receiving classrooms at industrial, business, and government locations.

time lost in traveling to the campus several evenings each week. In addition, video-taping permits make-up and review of lectures missed because of business trips or other organizational commitments.

Participating organizations may also, if they wish, help structure short in-house continuing education courses of all kinds for their employees. These are presented on the network when IIT courses are not in session.



Employee-students can attend IIT classes and participate in the IIT academic program without traveling to the IIT campus. A talk-back feature permits students in receiving classrooms to ask questions, respond to the instructor, and participate in classroom discussion just as if they were at IIT. In principle, any regular IIT lecture course at either the undergraduate or graduate level offered during either daytime or evening hours can be selected by the participating organization and placed on the network for the benefit of its employees.

Network students may earn academic credit leading to Master of Science degrees in several engineering fields and to the degree of Master of Business Administration without

Offerings such as introductory electronics, computer programming, management and leadership training, shorthand, and rapid reading are possible at cost levels only a fraction of those experienced by organizations operating separately.

Instructional television networks have proven educationally sound in California, Florida, Michigan, Minnesota, and Texas for several years.
