

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Although primarily focused on graduate education in engineering and business, courses offered by departments in the College of Liberal Arts also are available to meet a wide variety of student needs. Approximately 60 courses can be presented in the weekday late afternoon and evening hours during the academic year by using two TV channels simultaneously.

Tuition for special students is charged at regular IIT rates since they receive the full services of the faculty.



Regular Students

Network students are admitted to the academic program, register for classes by mail, and earn credit toward fulfilling the requirements for degrees just as a regular IIT student. They must meet existing IIT admission requirements and standards and pay tuition at the regular IIT rates.

Special Students

Employee-students may also attend televised classes after admission as special students and be tested and graded in a course even though they are not degree candidates. This provision is for students who may wish to demonstrate their academic ability for later admission to a degree program, or for those

Auditors and Seminars

An unlimited number of auditors from participating organizations are permitted in receiving classrooms for any course on the network. Auditors receive no testing or grading, no academic records are kept for them, and no tuition is charged.

Selected seminars in research fields of interest to network members are transmitted and available without fee to all personnel from these organizations.
