In the end, West Ham came out with a vital point in a 0-0 draw as they attempt to climb out of the relegation zone. Chelsea will be very disappointed in the loss of points when

every point counts at the top of the table if they hope to win the league. Chelsea has 50 points and will look to gain ground on the league leaders next week.

Former Chelsea man, Juan Mata, has recently moved to Manchester United after he struggled to make the Chelsea squad and had an instant impact. Mata provided the assist on the second goal of a 2-0 win over Cardiff City that will a massive lift for United as they have struggled in the league, but now welcome back Robin Van Persie and Wayne Rooney from injury to make a run at it.
