## Gunners falter in Premier League this week

Another fantastic week of results in the Barclay's Premier League has the title race tightening up at the top. The most impressive performance was by Chelsea as they absolutely battered Arsenal 6-0 at Stamford Bridge. It looked like a training exercise for the Blues, as they scored at will and left Gunners' supporters speechless. Goals from Eden Hazard, Andre Schurrle, Samuel Eto'o, Mohamed Salah, and a double by Oscar have left Chelsea at the top of the table with 69 points.

The Gunners sit in fourth place with 63 points. Liverpool leaped up to second with their 6-3 victory over Cardiff City that exemplified the Red's leaky defense and unstoppable attack.

Suarez netted a hat-trick while Skrtel scored a brace and Daniel Sturridge closing out the scoring. Liverpool now has 65 points with a
