Tracksters Complete 4 Weeks of Training

Opening the season in a quadrangular meet with Elmhurst, University of Chicago, and Wheaton at Stagg Field Saturday, at 2:00 p.m., the Illinois Tech track team will display the result of its four weeks training.

A prediction of the future of the team was most ably expressed by Coach Roy McCauley who, when asked about the teams chances in the coming meet replied, "See me the 21st, then I'll let you know."

Owing to the shortage of track teams in the vicinity, the thin-clads will have to depend less on dual meets and more on bigger meets of the type that the AAU (Amateur Athletic Union) sponsors to get them in top shape.

A new addition to the team from George Williams who gives promise the dashes is A/S Norman Hankins. He also excels in pole vaulting thus rounding out his already full track program.

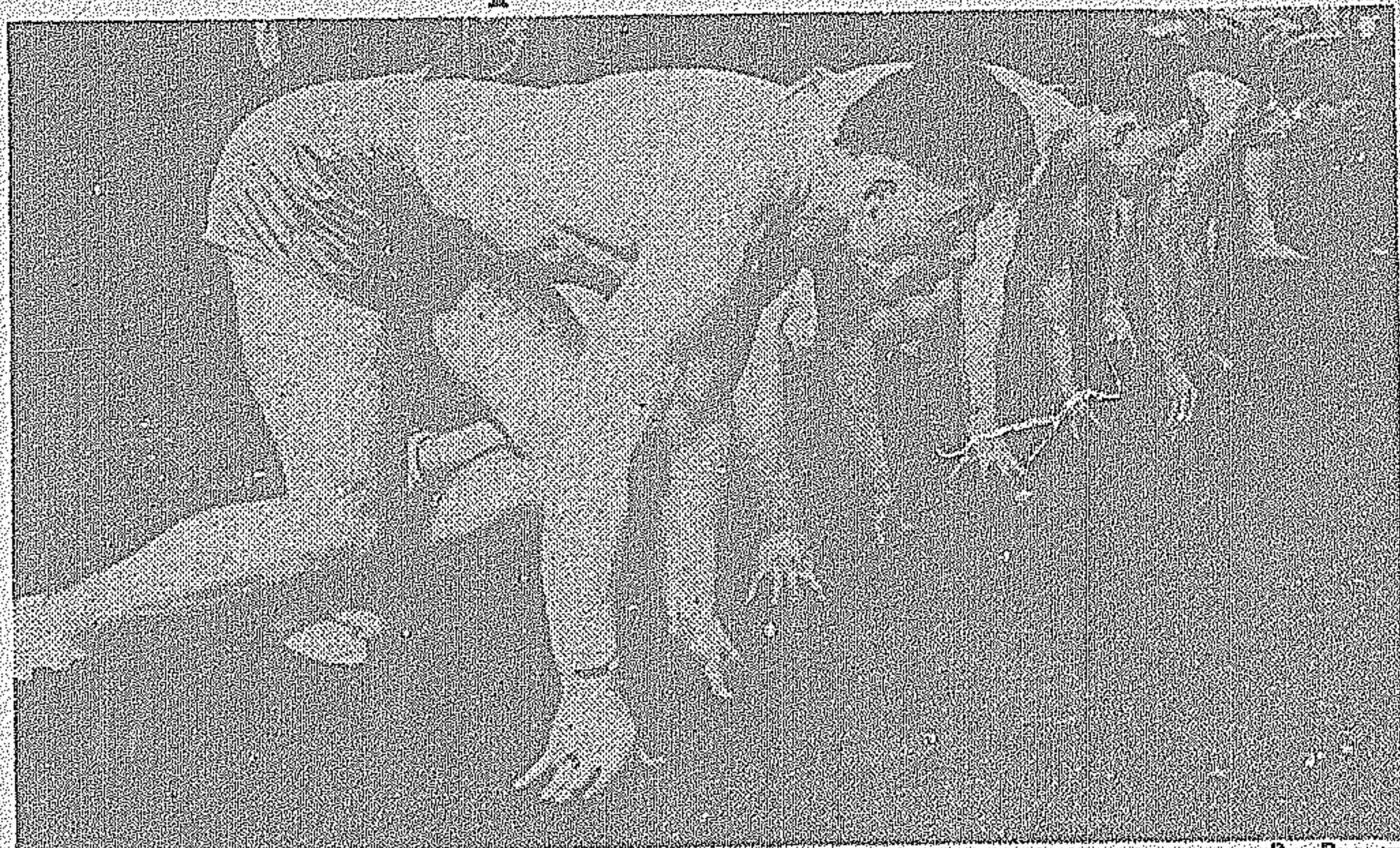

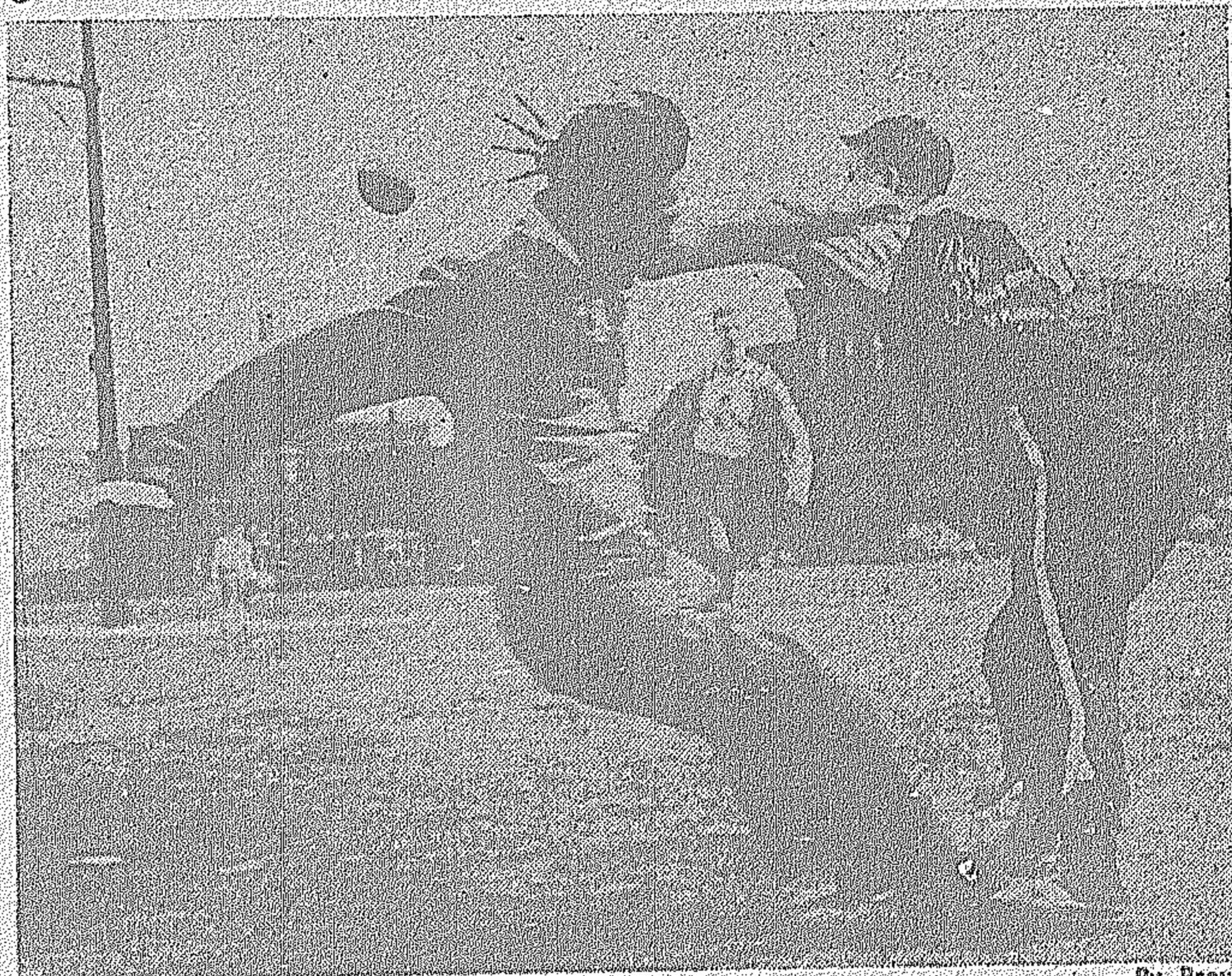
N.U. Navy Wins Over Tech 9-2

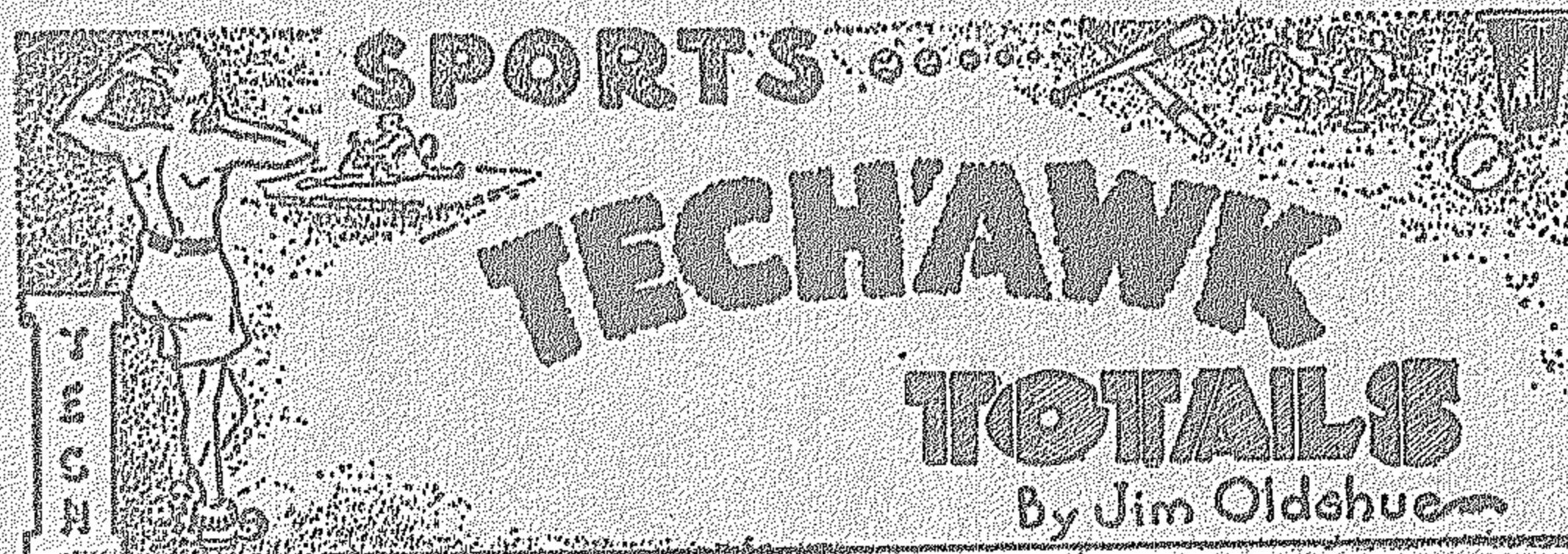
Ed Puchalski started on the mound for IIT and was charged with the loss. His main difficulty was due to walks and errors, since he only allowed four hits in his four inning stay.

This fellow, Herb Stoks, really had plenty of stuff and now has a contract with a big league farm team. He looked like the makings of a first-class hurler in the near future.

The Concordia shortstop Herb Moldenhauer was the terror of Tech pitchers last year. In their first encounter, he got six hits in six trips to the plate and in his first 13 times at bat last season, he walloped 13 hits. One of the Tech followers was heard to venture the opinion that Tech was very much improved this season since they had Moldenhauer relatively silenced. He only got three for five (one a homer) last Wednesday.

After throwing away the Concordia game because of errors, Coach "Sonny" Weissman has juggled the infield all around. This season, the team had one of the best turn out of infielders to appear for a couple of years. There are about nine infielders on the squad and they all seem to be fairly evenly skilled. If coach Weissman can just hit on the right combination, the team will be going places this season.

Bob Steward a/s is still having to carry the pitching load. None of the other hurlers have come around as yet to the point where they can share the load. As long as Tech only plays two games a week, Bob can handle the work, but it would be a big boost to the team to have another pitcher to share the load. According to Weissman, the team has all the possibilities in the world, and if they once get clicking, they'll turn in a good record.

Ogden field is certainly humming with activity these warm days. The baseballers are knocking balls all around. The softballers are playing in one corner, and the track men are tearing up the cinders around the outside.

What a wonderful day it will be when IIT can really get enough athletic facilities to handle all the activities.
