# Hankins, Cooley Score in CCC; Tech Places Tenth

With sprinter Norm Hankins collecting two points and hurdler Bill Cooley adding another, Illinois Tech placed tenth in the Central Collegiate Conference track meet held at the Great Lakes Naval Training Center last Saturday.

The two points garnered by Hankins came from his achieving fourth place in the 220 yard dash. Cooley's fifth place in the 120 yard high hurdles resulted in another for IIT.

In this meet two school records were broken, both by Hankins in the dashes. The first was in the qualifying heats of the 100 yard dash. His time of 9.9 seconds lowered the old record by a tenth of a second. A poor start in the finals robbed him of a chance to place in this event.

Later on in the 220 yard finals Norm was clocked in the record-breaking time of 22.0 seconds. This lowered the old school record by one-fifth of a second.

Meanwhile that morning Bill Cooley was qualifying in his two specialties, the 120 yard high hurdles and 220 yard lows. He proved successful in the highs but just missed out in the lows capturing sixth place.

The mile relay team of Tom Paulsen, Arnie Niemi, Ned Grable and Bill Thurston ran into trouble on the first half lap of this event. Paulsen, the initial runner was roughed up in the crowding on the first turn and so lost some yardage which neither he nor any of his team-mates could make up.

Both Cooley and Hankins deserve all the credit given them. They displayed that with a proper attitude toward training and a capable coach, results comparable to Big Ten schools could be attained.

Bill Cooley has been a member of the track team for the past three years. This, his senior year, sees him captain leading the team in spirit and in producing results. So far this year the team has shown itself equal to if not better than any of the preceding track teams.

All-around athlete Norm Hankins entered the IIT V-12 Unit through George Williams after attending several semesters at Lawrence Tech. A versatile athlete he has earned letters at basket ball and baseball also. His other accomplishments in the field of track are a six foot high jump and a twelve foot pole vault.

On Saturday the Techawks travel up to Northwestern to battle the Navy team there at 2:30 p. m.

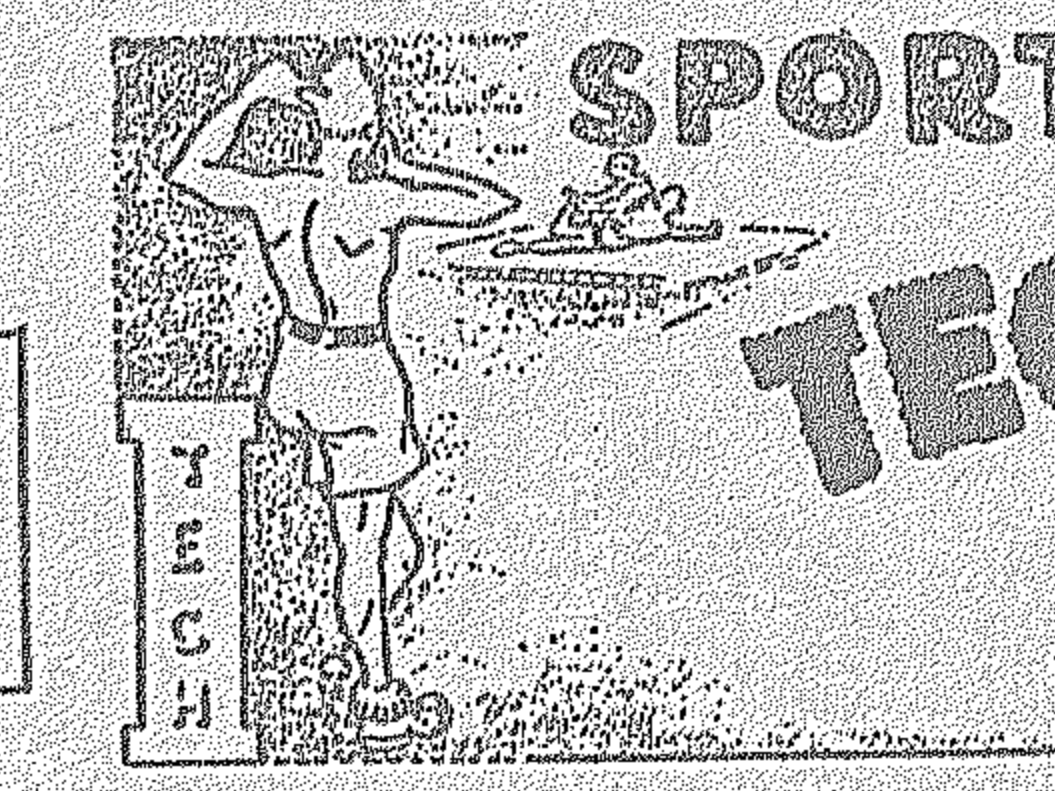
## Techawks Run Away With U of C Navy, 19 to 5

Illinois Tech's baseball team won its third straight game on Sunday, May 28, against the University of Chicago Navy team 19 to 5 in seven innings. This gave Tech a total of four wins, two losses, and one tie so far this season.

A/S Bob Steward was the winning pitcher for the Techawks and gave the U of C Navy only six hits. This is Steward's fourth victory against one loss.

The Techawk batsmen teed off three Navy pitchers for 13 hits and utilized six errors to score their 19 runs. Included in the 13 hits were six extra base blows. A/S Dick Holstrom came through with a triple, and A/S Bill Burns, Jim Oldshue, A/S Ted Macejewski, John Hiramoto, and Steward got two baggers.
