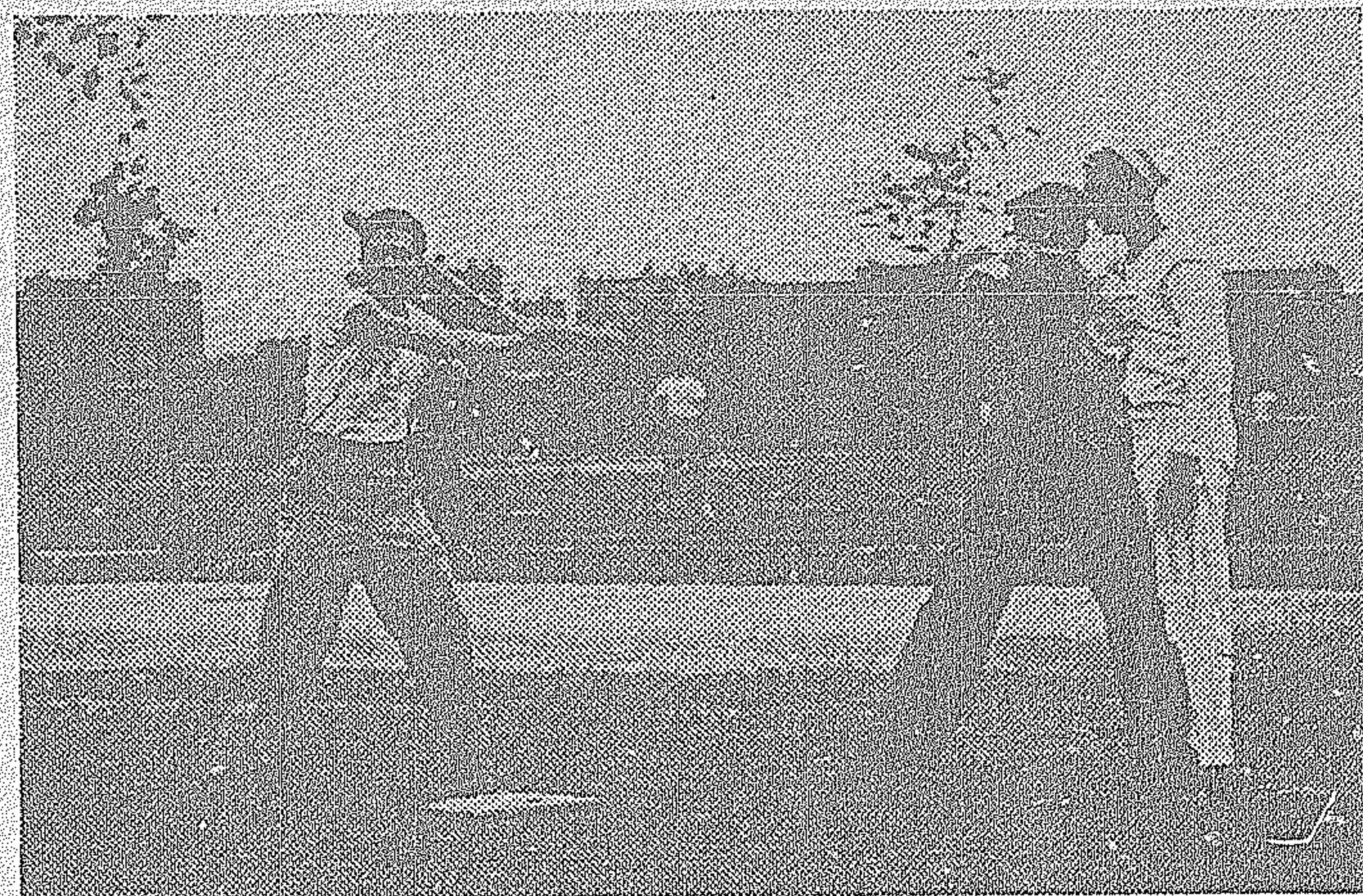
It is to be noted that due to the extra liberty given this evening, there will be no games tonight. Games will be played on Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.

Sophs Whip Frosh In 9-5 Softball Duel

Showing their first signs of life since their entering IIT some two or three semesters ago, the sophomore class challenged and then defeated the freshman class 9-5, in seven innings of a baseball game.

This class game is comparable to the series of contests staged by last term's sophomores with the then freshmen class.

The above mentioned game started off with a bang, the sophomores crossing the home plate three times in the first inning.

After this initial lead was established by the sophomores, it was never lost for the rest of the game. Additions of three runs each were made in the third and sixth innings by the sophomores, while the freshmen were only able to get a total of five men to cross the home plate.

An interested sideline about this sophomore team is the fact that four of its members are ex-servicemen. They are: Henry Pype, Bill Ludwig, Bob Tracy, and Lenard Donarsky.

Weissman Has Varied Career

Known to the majority of students at IIT as "Sonny", Bernard Weissman, Student Union manager, assistant athletic director, boxing coach, wrestling coach, and baseball coach is now entering upon his seventeenth year at Armour.

The little fellow with the big cigar in his mouth first claimed attention when he was an eight letter man at Lane Tech, starring in baseball, basketball, track and soccer. While at Lane he was a member of the National High School Championships baseball team of that year.

In 1924 he entered De Paul University and in 1928 graduated with an AB and an LLB degree, finding time to box and play baseball during his four year stay.

In September of 1928, he became Armour's boxing coach, and in 1932, when wrestling was revived, he took on the duties of wrestling coach. From 1928 to 1934 he worked in a law office, still finding time to put out good boxing and wrestling teams.

From April, 1934, to November, 1937, he also served the United States government as an enforcement officer in the Internal Revenue department. His duties there are obviously secretive and not much is known.

In December of 1938, Sonny was appointed Student Union Manager and in 1939 he became assistant athletic director to John J. Schommer, athletic director of Illinois Tech. The coaching of the baseball team was added to his duties in the fall of 1940.

Bernard Weissman is well known as a referee, having held a National Amateur Association license to referee since 1934. Since 1936, he has been chief second in the Golden Gloves Tournament of Champions in Chicago. He has refereed the Chicago Golden Gloves tournaments in Springfield and Davenport for the past couple of years.

Early in the year 1939, he began refereeing professional fights at both the Marigold and White City boxing emporiums. Since the United States entered the war, much of his time is spent deciding matches between local service teams.

During all the years that Sonny has handled the wrestling teams they have always ended up with a better than .500 average.

It was with a great deal of satisfaction that I noticed the present upswing in the activities of the sophomore class. Previous to this there was a tendency prevailing among that class to let things ride as they were without doing anything to help out.

This upswing first became evident when the election committee was deluged with nine petitions for the various open offices in the sophomore class. This active movement continued with a challenge to the freshmen to settle the supremacy of their respective baseball teams. The result of this was the defeat of the freshmen nine to five and an open road along which the sophomore class can continue with future successes if they so desire. The class has the ability, all they need is the initiative.

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Behind Chapin Hall surrounded by a high fence as if to protect something valuable is a patch of ground officially termed "the tennis courts." Any relation between that patch of land and an actual tennis court is purely a figment of someone's imagination.

Their condition can be surmised from the fact that before anyone would even consider using the IIT tennis courts, he would gladly travel to the University of Chicago courts or over to Armour Square. To the navy student, both of these places are out of bounds and a special pass needed before these facilities can be appreciated.

The failure of them to do so, restricts the already few chances of a student engaging in some helpful relaxation around the campus. With the intramural tennis tourney coming on shortly, the necessity for this to be done is increased.

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If things go as planned the rifle team will be added to the list of minor sports on the IIT campus. Several semesters ago the rifle team was assimilated by the Rifle Club due to the team's lack of interest and eventually lack of members. Thus for a short while Illinois Tech lacked a rifle team with which to compete with the other schools in the vicinity.

Largely through the efforts of A/S Larry Johnson, A/S Gil Katz, and Leonard Brown this movement, to have an active rifle team on the campus has been initiated. A budget of the teams expenses has been submitted to the ITSA which has been referred to the assistant athletic director, Bernard Weissman. Upon his approval and the following approval of the ITSA, the rifle team will proceed with regulated practice sessions under the guidance of Professor John Mangold, the team's sponsor.
