

Tech Thinclads Lose 68½-62½

Hankins High Points in Defeat to Lawrence

Illinois Tech trackmen lost to Lawrence College, Appleton, Wisconsin by a score of 68½ to 62½. Norm Hankins again led Tech scorers with a total of 19½ points in placing first in the high jump event, the 100 and 220 yard dashes and tying for first in the pole vault. In running the 220 yard event, Norm shattered the previous Tech record of :22.1 with a fast :21.9. He also broke the high jump record with a leap of 5 feet 11 inches.

Waldemar Karkow of Lawrence placed first in both the mile and two mile events. The Tech relay team took top honors in this event in 1:36.1. Dick Papps won the broad jump with a leap of 20 feet 11½ inches, placed second in the 220 yard low hurdles and third in the 120 yard high hurdles. Co-Captain Bob Thurston ran the 880 yard event in :20.4.

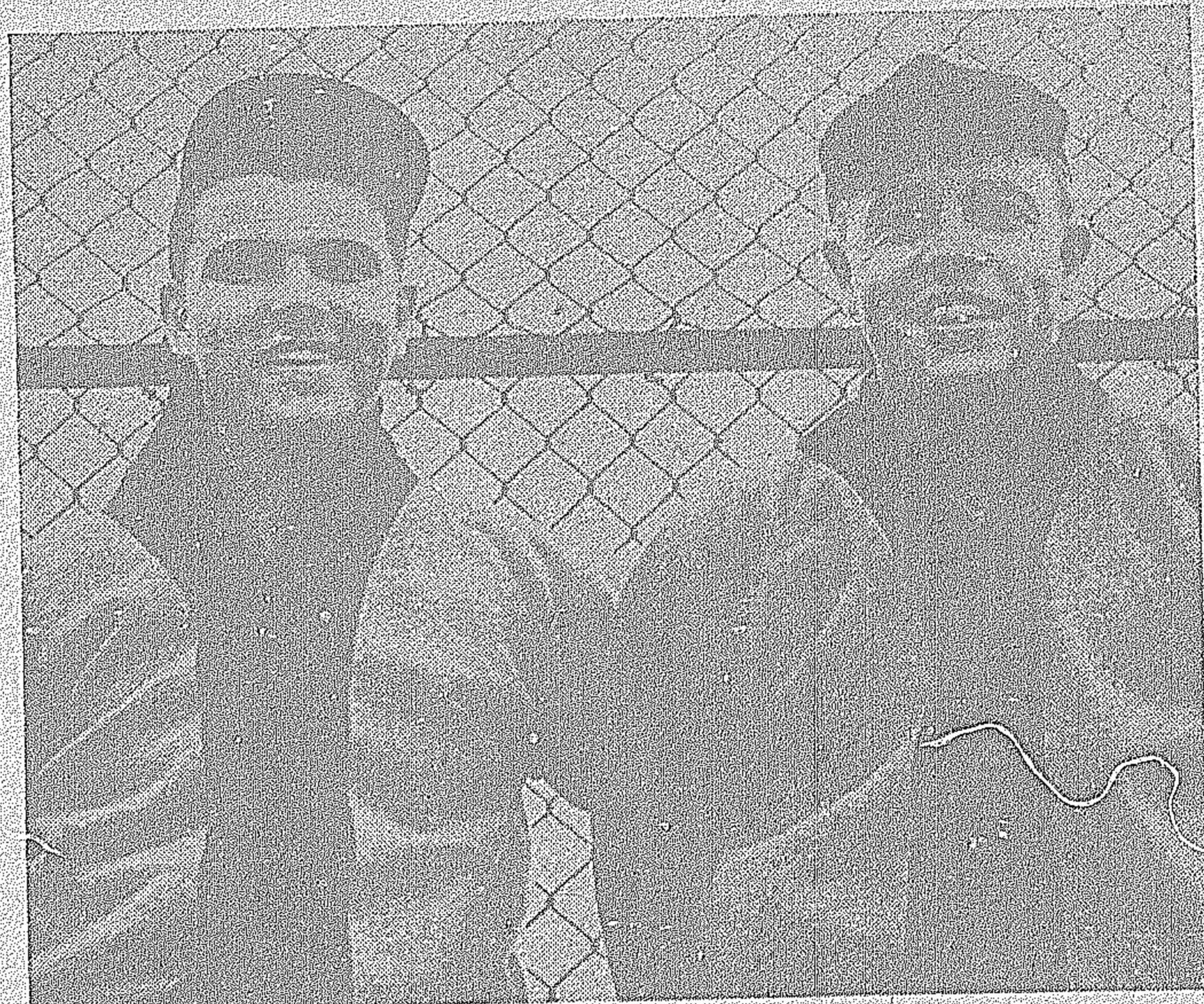

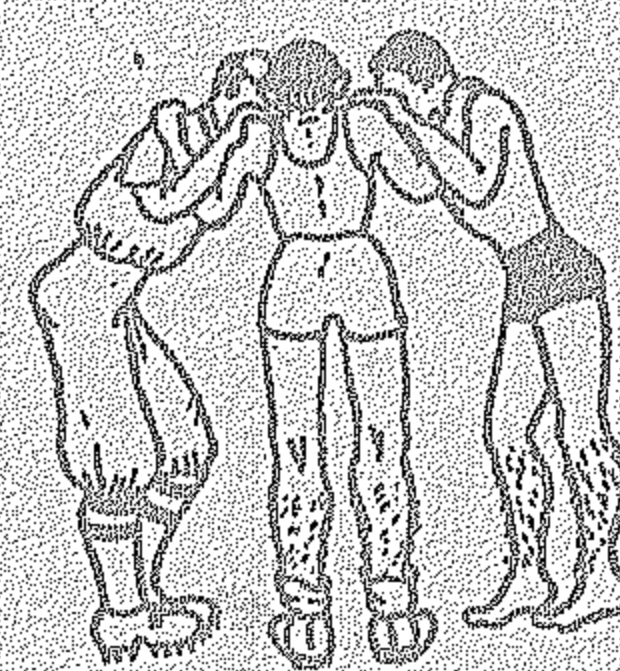

After graduating in 1940, Ray worked prior to enlisting in the Navy, where he spent an enjoyable 16 months as a machinist mate 3/c. The Navy sent him to Purdue University where Ray found time to earn a major letter playing baseball. After two semesters, he was sent to Geo. Williams and thence to Armour. His hitting and ground covering ability in center field has won the admiration of the opposition as well as his fellow players. He pitched for the Match Corporation Team last summer and was instrumental in his team's accomplishment of annexing the Chicago Championship.

Gene Evers prepped at Collinsville Township High School in Collinsville, Illinois. Another 3 sport man while at high school, Gene participated in football, basketball, and baseball. He was a member of the Southwestern Conference Championship basketball team which annexed the ship in 1942-43. Upon graduation in '43 Gene went to George Williams via V-12, where he participated in basketball and baseball. From there he came to IIT. Gene played summer baseball and was a standout pitcher.

Evers Allows 5 Hits for Third Win; Stidham and O'Geary Leading Tech Batters

Unleashing a 14 hit assault on 3 opposing pitchers, Illinois Tech defeated the Naval Armory Shore Patrol team by a score of 9 to 0 last Saturday at Ogden Field. Gene Evers went all the way for Tech and allowed but 5 hits and 2 walks. He also connected for two of Tech's hits.

Senior Mechs Best House 5

Staving off a late rally, the Senior Mechs, last year's champions, emerged victorious over the Quarters #5 aggregate by a score of six to four. Held to one hit for the first five innings, Quarters #5 unleashed a two run assault in the last of the sixth and scored two more runs in the last of the seventh. With two out, two men on base in the last half of the seventh, Tom Kilgariff, the Mech pitcher, forced Dan Bodor to pop up, thus ending the game. Jack Gustafson, hurling for Quarters #5, settled down after four innings and pitched good ball for the remainder of the game. He was supported by some neat fielding on the part of Ed Bald and Vic Miezowski. Leading hitters for the Mechs were Ned Grable, Tom Kilgariff, and Mike Vogt, who connected for two hits in four trips to the plate.
