

Tech Places Three in Central Collegiate Conference Meet

Hankins Captures 220 Yard Dash in .22; Hammack Second in 440; Thurston Fifth in 880

The Illinois Tech track team scored 10 points in the Central Collegiate Conference track meet at Great Lakes Saturday to tie for eighth place. The Great Lakes team captured the meet by scoring a total of 48 points.

Norm Hankins continued to show his supremacy in the 220 yard dash by capturing this event in 22 seconds. Wet grounds slowed the runners down quite a bit and with any breaks at all, Norm could have broken his own record in this event.

Jack Hammack placed second in the 440 yard dash, running behind Lee Hofacre of Drake who won the John P. Nicholson trophy. This trophy is one of the highest intercollegiate honors and is awarded to the man with the best performance in the meet.

Bob Thurston placed fifth in the 880 yard run.

Leading batter for the Tech team was shortstop Bob Hauser, who garnered two hits in three trips to the plate.

Two more games are to be played before the end of the present semester.

Coached by Sp.(A)1/c C. L. Richards, the present plans are to interchange the men and their positions so as to find the smoothest working combination. There will be a loss of approximately a half a dozen men at the end of the semester.

In addition to providing full tuition and fees for the entire four years, these scholarships provide for summer employment with fire insurance companies, as well as a three year internship in the inspection and rating bureau service following graduation.

Illinois Tech has graduated more than 400 fire protection engineers since 1903, when the department was founded, although the supply has never met the demand for graduates. Approximately 330 scholarships have been awarded in that time.
