

FOUR Pi Kaps Win IF Softball Title Champ Intramural Sftoball Team

The interfraternity softball championship was decided Thursday, when the Pi Kaps defeated the Alpha Sigs in a thrilling 10-inning game, 5 to 4.

The Alpha Sigs pushed 1 run across in the first inning and 2 more in the second. Their defense faltered momentarily in the last of the second and the Pi Kaps took advantage of the situation and tallied once. Wagner Larson allowed 3 hits in the last of the third, one a double by Jack Capron, who drove in 2 Pi Kap runs.

Neither team scored in the fourth. The Sigs gained a 1 run lead in the first of the fifth as a result of successive hits by Bob Freund, Norm Schmitz, and Gene Evers. In the last of the sixth the Pi Kaps tied the score at 4 all. Due to airtight defense on the part of both teams, neither was able to score again until the tenth inning.

In the last of the tenth, Tom Ruck singled, Len Donarski doubled, Ruck going to third. Dick Stark walked to fill the bases and with two outs, Jack Capron came through once again, this time with a double, driving home the winning run.

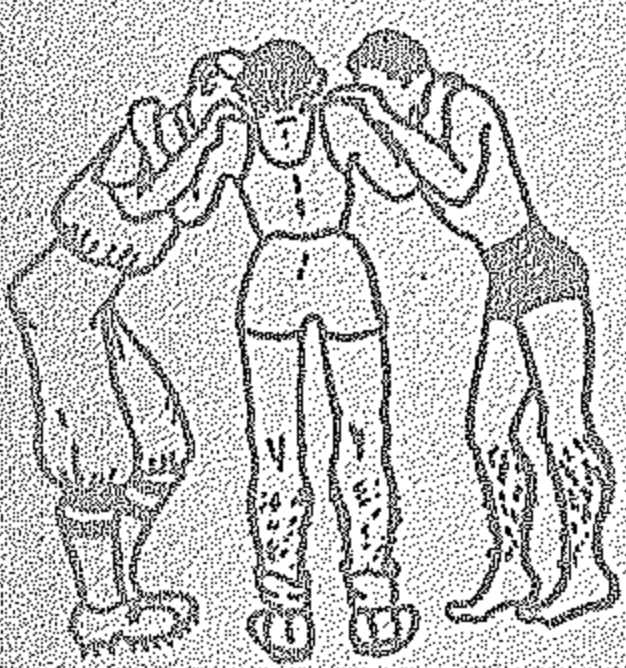

Scoring their third victory in as many contests, the Illinois Tech Navy softball team defeated the Chicago Shore Patrol team by a score of 7 to 0, Wednesday, at Grant Park.

Ray Murphy turned in his second shutout in a row while allowing 2 hits. He was credited with 5 strike-outs.

The first 3 SP's were retired in order in the first inning. Bill Burns led off for Tech and was safe on an error. Ed Bald singled, and then Roy Schimmelpfennig promptly connected for a round tripper, driving in 3 runs. This, incidentally, was Roy's first hit in 7 attempts. The next two men flied out, Bob Hauser singled, but Bud Kleeman fanned to end the inning.

It was three up and three down for the SP's in the second as two went down via strike-outs, the other flying-out.

Bill Crowley opened the Tech second by flying out, and successive singles by Marini, Martin, and Burns produced 1 run. An infield out by Bald and a double by Shimmel and a single by Murphy accounted for 3 more to end the scoring for the game.

Shore Patrol collected two hits in the first of the seventh to spoil Roy's chance for a no-hit game.

Leading Tech hitters were Roy Schimmelpfennig, Bob Hauser, and Paul Martin, with two hits in 3 times at bat.
