Mr. Thomas S. McEwan, Chicago Consulting Engineer, keynoted last Friday's ASME meeting with a talk on "Engineering Today and in the Post-war World."

Professor R. A. Budenholzer termed his words, "A real challenge to the students of today."

Later, McEwan was asked for his comments on aspiring engineering graduates. He said that ability in the form of a good scholastic and activity record was looked for by employers. Unless the employer knows the difference between scholastic requirements of the school, he added, they just take the grades at face value.

Arthur O'Neill, recently pledged, is the 13th pledge this semester.

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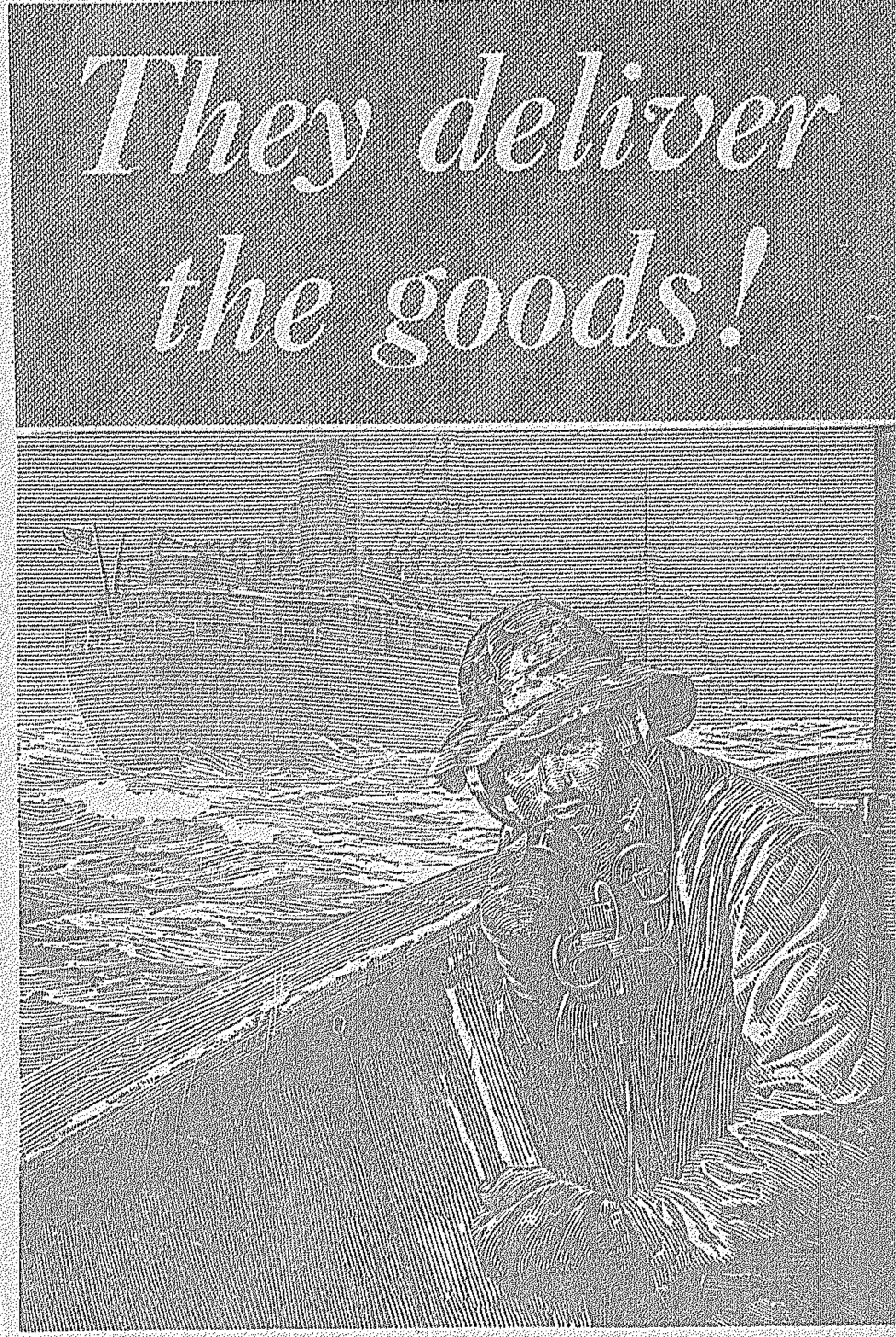
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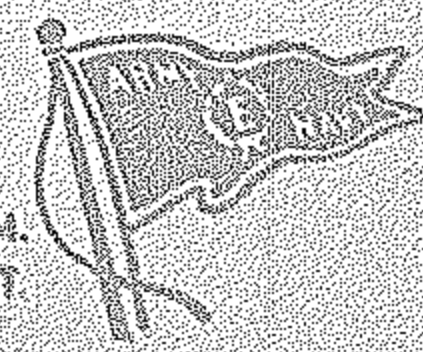
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
