

IIT Shuts Out Inspectors 12-0

Murphy's Homer Puts V-12'ers Ahead Early

Illinois Tech's V-12'ers strengthened their grip on first place in the Navy softball league Wednesday when they walloped the Inspectors of Naval Material 12 to 0 at Grant Park.

Ray Murphy turned in a fine exhibition of softball pitching, striking out 12 men. Backed by a team which collected 13 hits against 1 for the Inspectors, it was IIT all the way.

Bob Hauser led off the batting order, getting a single on an error by the first baseman, Hornaday. Then Ray Murphy slapped out a home run, scoring the first two runs of the game. Mieskowski, third man up, was walked, and brought home by sacrifice hits by Schimmelpfenig, McAdam, and Ferguson.

High inning of the game was the second when the entire team batted around and picked up six runs. With two men on and two down, Mieskowski came up with a triple that scored two and put him in scoring position. Schimmelpfenig followed through by getting on by an error in short center, and McAdam drove him in with a single. McAdam died on first when Ferguson flied out.

On the Inspector's side of the score sheet, their lone hit came in the fourth inning when Clock banged out a single. Murphy put down the next three as they came, and the Inspector's only scoring chance failed.

The sore spot will be at second base which was vacated by Sig Pyzik. Two newcomers who show great promise are A/S Gelb and Dave Hoffman and either will be assigned the sack. Gone along with Pyzik are: Dennis O'Geary, first baseman; Dick Holstrom, third baseman; Bill Crowley, shortstop; Maciejewski, left field; and Byron Fanselow, second base.

Bob Lichtman will once more take over duties at first after doing a good job behind the plate. Mel Stidham, the other catcher last season will be shifted to the outfield and the opener will probably find Vic Mieskowski as official backstop.

Ray Murphy the old reliable who is adept at most any position is permanently installed at third, while Roy Schimmelpfenig, who batted in the .300 class two seasons ago, will draw an outfield berth. Bob Hauser will continue to patrol right field as he did in great style last season. Fran Krawczak should have another good season at shortstop.

"Sonny" has had difficulties arranging a definite schedule for the summer term as most of the colleges are not operating at present, but there are a few service teams such as Shore Patrol, Vaughn, 87th Street Navy, who should furnish plenty of opposition. "Sonny" will be out to better the 4-win and 5-loss record for last term.

Illinois Tech Places Second In Central A. A. U. Track Meet

Campus Business Team Takes First, Hankins, Thurston, and Papps Star for Tech.

Illinois Tech placed second, amassing a total of 119½ points in the Central A.A.U. track meet at Key Branch Stadium on June 23.

Norm Hankins placed third in both the 100 and 220 yard dashes and Co-captain Bob Thurston ran third in the 880 yard run. Dick Papps placed third in the hop, step, and jump event and fifth in the broad jump.

Friday Is Deadline For Entry in IM Softball Tourney

Definite intramural plans for the current term have recently been drawn up which call for softball, tennis, horseshoes and possibly golf and swimming.

Team entries consisting of 15 men should be turned in by Friday, July 20, to either the intramural box in the Student Union or to "Sonny" Weissman's office. Intramural medals, emblematic of school supremacy in the sport, will be awarded to the winning team players. As an added attraction, the winners will be pitted against "Weissman's Wildcats," a team made up of 10 hungry ballplayers, and the winners will be crowned school champs.

The last tourney was won by the powerful Senior Mechs, who also won the last two previous softball tournaments as sophomores and juniors.

program. Dr. Heald announced that he hoped to see work begin "very soon" on two other new structures—a \$350,000 Humanities Building and a \$600,000 Metallurgy and Chemical Engineering Building.

The first actual ground was removed by A/S Warren S. Witus, of Detroit, Michigan, a first semester freshman in the navy program who, from point of academic standing, is the youngest member of the unit.

It will contain 10 classrooms for teaching of navy classes, an ordnance laboratory and armory, eight suites of offices, three storage rooms, and a full regulation rifle range in the basement.

The Dahl-Stedman Company, 11 South LaSalle Street, is the contractor. Ludwig Mies van der Rohe, professor of architecture at Illinois Tech and director of the Institute's architectural curriculum, has designed the building.

Leading point maker for the afternoon was Bob Kelley of Illinois, competing under the banner of Campus B. A. Bob won the mile, the half mile and the 440 yard high hurdles for the only triple victory of any individual man.

Dwight Eddleman formerly an Illini took first in the broad jump and the high jump.
