The Senior Mechs made it known that they intend to repeat as champions as they whipped the Junior Electricals 11 to 2. Tom Blim hurled for the winners and was greatly aided by some stellar defensive play on the part of Vic Mieszkowski and Bob Negele. The Junior battery of DeWitt Pickens and Joe Hardman could do little to stop the onslaught.

The contest between the Freshmen Chems and the Hi Jacks, another Frosh entry, was forced into an extra inning, the Chems finally coming out on top 5 to 4.

A twenty hit barrage, marked by C. Chamber's two home runs in successive trips to the plate, aided the Senior Electricals as they bowled over the Junior Mechs 15 to 3. In all, Chambers accounted for 6 of the Senior runs.

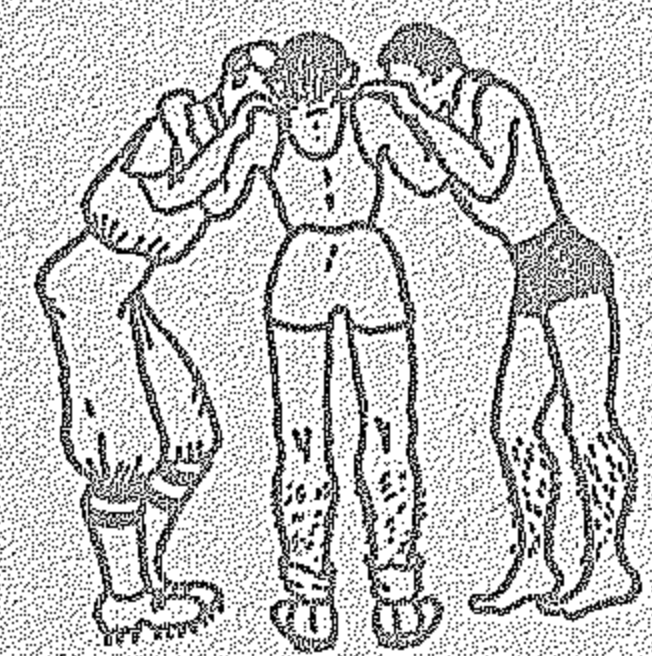

NetSquad Wins Over Concordia Three Opponents to Be Faced This Week

The Techawk net squad, with two more decisive victories to its credit, will play three matches in five days this week in an attempt to run its win streak to nine straight for the summer season.

Last Tuesday the netters faced their first collegiate opponents of the semester as they defeated a surprisingly strong Concordia squad 5 to 2 on the University of Chicago Midway.

A 6-1, 6-2 win by Jerry Evert over Schumacher, the Teachers' number one man, set the pace with both Gene Hill and Fred Leydig, playing number three and four positions, respectively, coming from behind to win. Hill triumphed 9-7, 6-2, and Leydig rallied strongly to win in three sets, 1-6, 7-5, 6-1. Bill Cannon and Glenn Park both lost in straight sets.

In doubles play Evert-Cannon won handily, 6-1, 6-3, and Hill-Leydig came through, 6-2, 6-2.

The Techawks remained the class of the Chicago Area Naval Tennis League at the expense of the Cost Inspectors, winning 3-0 in a Friday match played at Grant Park. The four-man squad dropped but 16 games while winning 36.

Results: Evert (IIT) defeated Bergquist (CI), 6-1, 6-2; Hill (IIT) defeated Moss (CI), 6-3, 6-4; Cannon-Leydig (IIT) defeated Young-Truegood, 6-3, 6-3.

Tonight the Techmen will play a postponed Navy match at Armour Square with the Naval Intelligence team. Tomorrow at 5:00 p.m. they will face Concordia here in a return match which may well go either way, while later in the week Glenview will provide the opposition in a Navy League match to be played at Fullerton Tennis Club. Bud Hart, brother of nationally ranked Doris Hart, will provide Evert with his first really good opposition to date.
