

Tech Softball Squad Takes Double Victory, 14-2, 1-0

Team Wins Thirteenth Straight Game; Krawczak and Kleeman Lead Tech Hitters

Tech's V-12 softball team came through with two more victories in games played last Wednesday at Grant Park Tech walloped S.U. 9812 by a score of 14 to 2 and won over Radio Chicago by a margin of 1 to 0. The latter game was called after 4½ innings because of darkness.

Against S.U. 9812 the Techawks really cut loose on a scoring spree. They scored in every inning except the seventh. Fran Krawczak and Gene Kleeman both slammed out round trippers.

In the first inning Bob Hauser doubled and advanced to third on an outfield fly by Fran Krawczak, and later scored on a long fly by Ray Murphy.

Dave Hoffman opened up the second with a single. After Vic Mieszkowski popped up, Howie MacAdams singled. Hoffman and Mieszkowski both scored on an error by the right fielder on Gene Kleeman's long drive. Kleeman scored the third run of the inning on an infield out.

Krawczak scored another tally in the third after singling. He went to second on Murphy's infield out and crossed the plate on an error by the short centerfielder.

Run No. 5 was scored by Mieszkowski. He got on first after an error by the shortstop. Vic reached second on an infield out and scored on a single by Bill Butler.

In the fifth inning, 6 Tech runners crossed the payoff rubber. Hauser started the doings with a single to left. Krawczak came through with a home run to score Hauser in front of him. Murphy singled and went to second on an infield out. Ray scored on a sharp single by Hoffman. Mieszkowski was safe on a fielder's choice. Howie Poulter drew a base on balls. Kleeman knocked the second round tripper of the inning to score runs 10, 11 and 12.

After Hauser popped up in the sixth, Krawczak reached first by virtue of a walk. Murphy singled and then Jim Stewart singled to score Krawczak. John McCabe produced another single that scored Stewart with the final tally.

Radio Chicago really gave the Techawks a battle. The only Tech run was scored in the second frame.

After one out, Hoffman smashed a single to center. Mieszkowski drove out another single to advance Hoffman as far as third base. Howie MacAdams was safe on an error by the third baseman. The error allowed Hoffman to cross the plate with the run that produced victory. The game was called after Radio Chicago had been up to bat in the fifth.

The two victories enabled Tech to remain the No. 1 team in the league. So far they have won 13 straight contests in their quest for the Service League title.

Hits Plus Mech Errors Decide Title Playoff

The Senior Mechs tasted their first defeat of the season as the Freshmen Eagles triumphed 11 to 5. The victory earned the championship for the Frosh, and intramural medals, emblematic of their accomplishment, will be awarded them.

The Mechs won the toss and elected to take the field first with the Frosh at bat.

Cass Davidson led off the first inning by hitting a short fly to Glen Boston. Conrad Michalowski was out on a fly to Art Marcussen at short center field and was followed by Milt Weinberg, who fouled out to Bob Negele to end the inning.

The lead off man for the Mechs, Art Marcussen, grounded out, pitcher to first. Vic Mieszkowski hit safely to left field for a double. Al Dimoff popped up to the pitcher and

Jack Reding led off the second for the Eagles by smashing a single off of Tom Blim. Mort Neimeroff hit an easy roller to Negele who muffed the ball, putting runners on first and second. Anderson fouled to Dimoff and Bill Klein flied to Schimmel in left, making two outs. Woody Johns doubled two runs across and Joe Cooke flied to Marcussen for the third out.

Pete Browning flied out to short, and was followed by successive singles by Miller, Teppig, and Boston, filling the bases. Blim flied out to the short centerfield, Miller scoring. Teppig was out on a force play and Marcussen grounded out.

Davidson started the hit parade in the third with a single. Weinberg flied to Schimmel, who dropped the ball. Reding homered, driving in three runs. Neimeroff tripled to left but was left stranded as Anderson flied to short centerfield. The Eagles led at this point, 5 to 1.

Mike singled and went to third on an error. Dimoff lined out, and Schimmel grounded out. Negele doubled, scoring Mike. Browning grounded out to end the inning.

Klein of the Eagles singled in the fourth and scored as a result of Johns' home run. Cook flied out and Goehring hit a home run as the Eagles scored three runs.

The Mechs were unable to score in the last of the fourth, while the Eagles scored one as a result of a single by Reding over third and a double by Anderson in the fifth.

Techhawk Baseball Team Breaks Even in Season's Final Games

Schimmel Stars as Tech Defeats Jr. Cubs, 12-1; Prisoners Score in Seventh to Win, 8 to 5

The Techhawk baseball squad ran up one of their highest scores against the Junior Chicago Cubs at Ogden Field Thursday. The score was 12 to 1.

Roy Schimmelpfenig clouted one of the longest home run drives ever laid out on Ogden Field when he swung on the first pitched ball in the first frame and sent it out of the "park" to land in front of Main Building. Ray Murphy, who got on by a fielder's choice, was driven in to score the first two runs.

The entire team went around in the first inning and was retired when MacAdams, bringing up the end of the batting order, went down swinging.

The Cubs' side of that inning was three men, two of whom went down via the strikeout route.

The second inning ended for IIT with three men on, and no scores. Schimmelpfenig faced four Cub batters, giving away a walk and a single. The fourth batter, Mecker, hit into a fast pitcher-to-second-to-first double play to end the threat.

The Cubs gave away the third inning on errors, committing two and allowing three runs to come in.

Jack Capron went to first on Dorthy, the second basemen's error, and Mel Stidham poled him in, making it to second on Dorthy's second error of that frame. Stan Krawczak singled to drive in Stidham, and scored when Ray Murphy hit safely. Schimmelpfenig was thrown out at first to retire the side.

Frame five was the high spot of the six inning game, as IIT scored four runs. Murphy walked Schimmelpfenig. Bushelle and Gene Evers hit safely to score three. Evers was on second when Mel Stidham laid out a single which sent him home. Krawczak flied out to retire the side.

Gene Evers faced only three Cubs in the sixth and last inning, striking out one and putting out the other two at first.

Tying the score in the seventh inning with a four hit barrage, and then forging ahead in the eighth, brought the Indiana State Prison a victory over Illinois, 8 to 5.

The defeat brought an end to the summer campaign and thus gave Sonny a four win, three loss record in the seven game schedule.

Gene Evers struck out nine while giving up two passes and fourteen hits. Roy Schimmelpfenig led the Techhawk battsmen with three hits in four trips to the plate.

Tech scored three in the second on hits by Schimmel, Mieszkowski, and Hauser. The hits, incidentally, were doubles over the left field wall. Several spectators volunteered to recover the balls but the warden refused to allow it.

Indiana State scored one in the first on singles by Morton and Carranzas and a double by Starratt. They failed to score again until the sixth when they bunched three hits to tally two runs.

In the Indiana State seventh, four hits good for three runs put them ahead 6 to 5. They scored two more in the eighth to insure victory on successive doubles by Hall, Bigelow, and Smith.

Fran Krawczak led off the hitting in the Tech fifth with a triple. Murphy singled him home and then proceeded to steal second. Schimmelpfenig singled him home for the last Tech run of the game.

The Techawks hit safely in every inning with the exception of the first and seventh. Willoughby retired Stidham, Krawczak, and Murphy in order in the seventh.

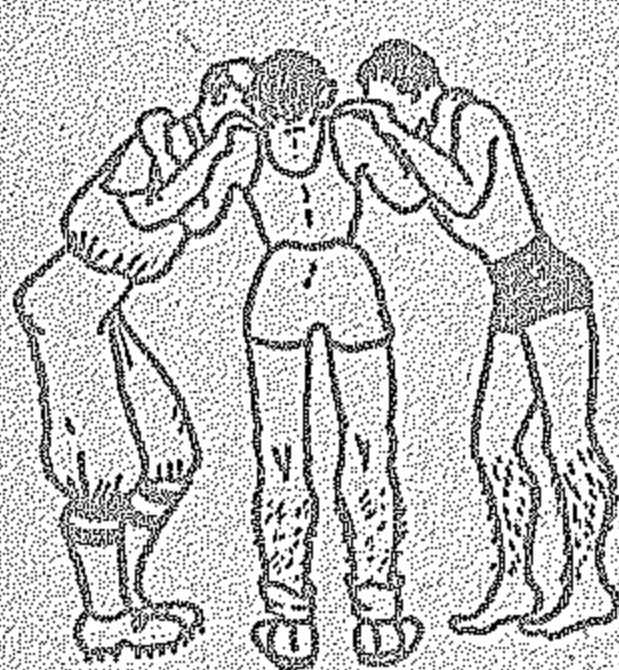
