

"Tilt" Light Glows on the New Chemistry Building

The U.S. Weather Bureau said the wind hit 27 m.p.h. At Thirty-third and Dearborn, it looked like the velocity had been much higher: The vertical beams of HT's new chemistry building had been twisted from their ticplates and the structure looked like a tilted pinball machine.

The reason for the apparent fiasco offered by the sidewalk superintendants were numerous and varied: "I told 'em they should've used rivets", said one engineer. "Naw, another said, "It happened because some civil didn't do his homework."

According to the construction crew, the setback was only slight. With the particular type of building being erected, it is necessary to bolt the structural members into place, align them, and then weld. The welding cannot be done until most of the beams are in place.

Gus Shoberg, foreman of the construction erew, declared "No permanent damage has been done, and steel guy wires are now being used to prevent a reoccurence of the incident.

"Steel deliveries have been excellent, and if the weather is favorable, the framework should be completed about Jan. 15."
