"Tobaccoland" has received wide acclaim both for its interest and educational value.

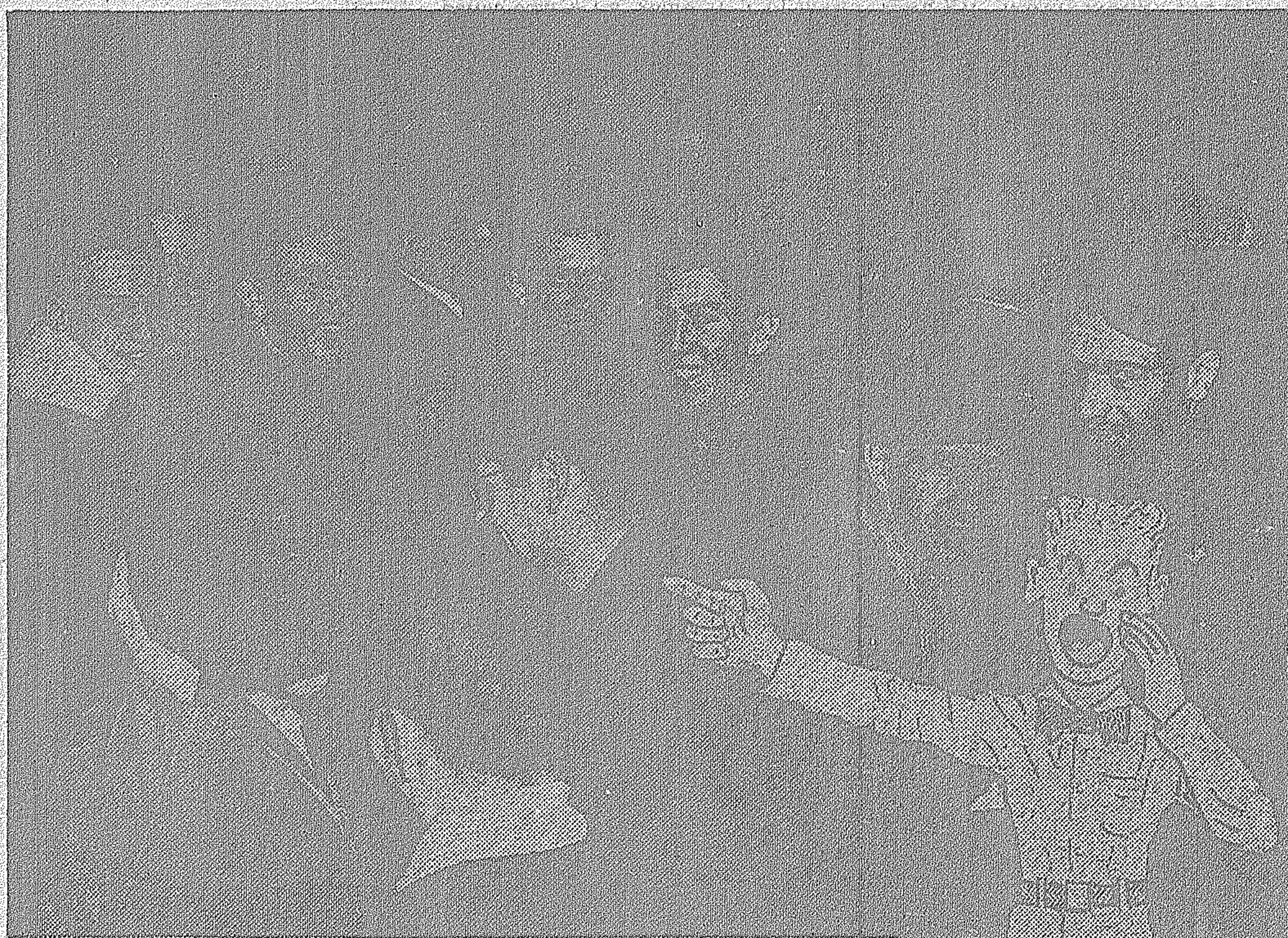
There is no admission charge, and all students and faculty members are invited.

## Panic Showers Installed In CB

It is now possible to get a free shower just inside the doors of classrooms in the Chemistry building.

Installed as a safety feature, these fixtures are known as "panic showers," intended for use whenever a student catches fire or receives a sudden splash of acid. They are capable of emitting a heavy gush of water expressly for the purpose of diluting trouble-making chemicals as quickly as possible.

The idea is not new, but the fixture design has eliminated some previous drawbacks. Old fixtures, like the ones now in the chemistry

labs of Main cannot be tested without seriously flooding the rooms, and quickly becoming clogged with sediment. The new fixtures feature an "upstream" design, directing a large amount of water upward against an umbrella-like cavity which scatters it downward.

The rooms now supplied with these showers will eventually be converted to laboratories.

Upon completion of the Metallurgical and Chemical building all of its laboratories will be equipped with panic showers.

## TWO New Registration Procedure Brings Volley of Cheers
