

Campus Cops To Receive New Shelter

The large conspicuous box on the corner of 33rd street and Federal is the new watchman's shack; the nerve center of IIT's police patrol. Though a curiosity for the day student, the shack fills an urgent need of the night student and the late worker on the campus.

A guard will be on duty here at all hours during the night. A phone and an outside trunk line will be available for students and employees desiring escort service in the campus area.

The shack has been so constructed and placed that the guard on duty has a clear view of both sections of Federal street, both directions on 33rd street, and the administrative center of the Institute.

Its greatest function will be as that of the night patrol's headquarters. The time-clocks will be stored there when the guards are off duty. Its electric heating will make it a boon for wet and chilly guards who heretofore have had to find shelter in some doorway. In addition, the guard on duty in the shack will be able to alert the rest of the patrol and the city police on a minute's notice in the event of trouble on the campus.

During such times as Junior Week and registration, it will serve as an information booth; its central location making it ideal for that purpose.

Graduation Announcements Arrive; To Be Distributed

"Graduation announcements ordered by January '48 graduates in December have been received," Anthony Dini, announcement committee chairman, stated.

They will be distributed tomorrow and Friday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the South Union.

Ahern Outlines Three Point Safety Program To Prevent Explosions

John J. Ahern, director of the fire protection and safety engineering department at Illinois Institute of Technology, outlined a three-point program for departments of fire, safety, building and health in American cities in order to prevent loss of life and property from gas explosion.

He urged cities to: 1) make more rigid and more frequent inspections of underground gasoline storage tanks, 2) require perforated rather than solid manhole covers, and 3) insist upon proper catch basins and sewer traps in industrial buildings and dwellings.

'UNESCO Begins At Home,' Says Teller

Sidney A. Teller, prominent social worker, writer, and lecturer, spoke to students and faculty at an all-school assembly Thursday on the topic "UNESCO Begins At Home."

Mr. Teller, who recently served as an observer for Illinois Tech and several other organizations at the Mexico City UNESCO meeting, outlined the six-point program that has been set up to further UNESCO's objectives in individual communities. His points were illustrated with information on the operation and administration of UNESCO and with comments on amusing incidents of the Mexico City meeting.

He pointed out that students here have an excellent opportunity to promote understanding between nations by inviting the foreign students enrolled at IIT into their family circles to show them American home life.

He closed his talk with the thought that there is much to be done in raising standards of living and educational levels throughout the world, and that the help of all is needed to insure UNESCO's success in its endeavors.
