## Maatman Aids Leiser To Snag Second Win

### Victory Follows 11-9 Loss To Concordia In Conference Game

The Scarlet and Gray won a well played game 4-3 from Chicago Teachers college Friday at Armour Square after losing their previous outing 11-9 to Concordia. Bob Leiser proved himself to be the Techawks' outstanding pitcher when he chalked up twelve strike-outs and allowed only three hits against the Teachers.

Up to the seventh inning Leiser had a no-hitter in his hands but Braune, lead off man for the Teachers upset the apple cart by pounding a hard single to deep right center. Maatman's retrieve held Braune at first, but Leiser's high hopes for a perfect game were banished.

#### Hawks Star Afield

The Teachers added a walk, a hit and were aided by an error to score two runs in this inning. They came back in the eighth once more after Excell hit a ground rule double down the third base line to drive in Kuzendorf who was on base by virtue of being hit by a pitched ball.

Leiser was aided in winning by the brilliant performances of Jerry Maatman and Swede Swanson. Maatman made a beautiful catch of a long fly hit by Briggs in the first half of the sixth. The Tech center fielder seemed to sense the direction of the ball as he was off at the crack of the bat and didn't stop running until he had the pellet in his hands. At this time he was somewhere in the general direction of the Three Ducees and the end of the park.

Big Inning Wins

The Techmen scored all four runs in the third inning and had a total of six hits, all singles. Four hits were made in the third, one in the first, and one in the fourth.

Concordia's Kittens took full advantage of six Techawks errors to score their 11-9 victory last week. It was Tech's second straight conference defeat.

The Techmen clubbed the ball all over the lot, collecting 17 safe blows, but didn't get them at the right time, and left runners stranded on the base paths.

Kittens Pound Ball

Paul Peterson was the starting Tech moundsman and was charged with the loss. "Pete" ran into trouble in the top half of the third when he was tagged for a double, triple, and home run. In this same inning, he walked one batter and was further victimized by "Vinny" Haughey's error.

Bert Amstader relieved Peterson and held the damage to five runs. Amstader pitched well, striking out six and yielding five hits and a brace of walks during his four inning stretch. However, Concordia's power boys, Bathje and Vallesky got to Amstader for a triple and home run, respectively in the sixth to boost the Kittens tally to ten runs.

McDonough Checks Sluggers

Bill McDonough stymied Concordia from the seventh inning on, fanning five, while his team mates tried hard to get back into the game.

The Hawks scored single runs in the third, sixth, and seventh. They got two in the fifth and fought bitterly to get four more in the ninth. Total—nine runs, too little and too late.

Other leading scorers for IIT were Bruce Genis, 77, and number six man, Dave Felsenthal, 79. Felsenthal surprised in winning his singles by three points.

The team was handicapped by the loss of number one man, Blaha. Blaha was incapacitated due to a chemistry exam.

This last minute method of winning seems to be very popular with the Techmen. In the Loyola game Kelly, number six man for the Techawks, sank a putt for a birdie on the 18th hole to score the final point in a 14-13 victory.
