

Senior Poll Shows 65 Per Cent Prefer Informal Farewell

Three graduating seniors have completed a survey among their classmates on the question of the Senior Farewell's mode of dress, formal or informal.

Results of the survey indicate that 65 per cent of these students prefer an informal Farewell. A majority of this percentage definitely will not attend the affair if it is formal, according to the tabulated results.

Irv Kovnat, Louis Fisher, and Bernard Brenner, the instigators of the survey, stated that their action followed "dissatisfaction with the results of the vote taken."

A total of 197 statements were obtained by the three seniors. Some graduates did not sign, explaining that they would not attend the Farewell in either case.

Kovnat, Fisher and Bremer stated that, "Because of the results of the survey, we believe that plans for the dance should be reconsidered."

Burns presented his observations before the Newman club Wednesday in the Chemistry building auditorium. He based his claim that communism is reactionary on the belief that communist theory is "contented with the things that are now in the world; it just wants more of them."

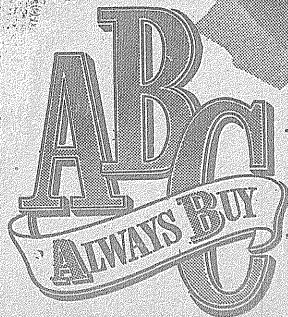
