Their names were submitted to the publisher by a committee of Eugene Pare, assistant dean of students; Bernard Weissman, director of student unions; John Maklelski, assistant dean of engineering; and Fred Travis, director of admissions. The following students were selected:

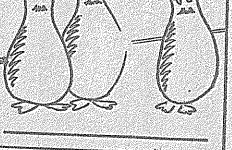
