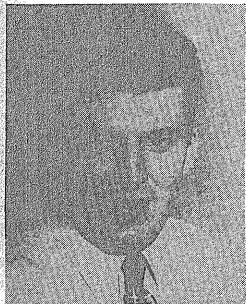


Senior candidates state platforms

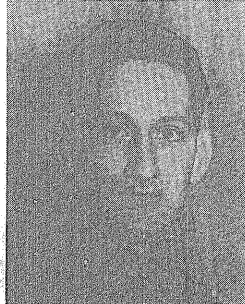


ROBERT KARLICEK

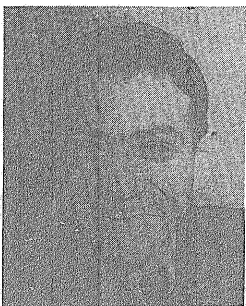

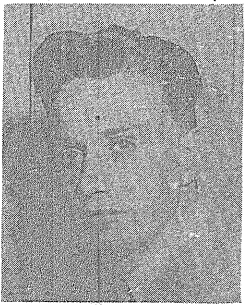
