

Savage, Callan, Delves, Adams, and Hogenson, running in the order named, were beaten by Hyde Park and by Milwaukee Academy.

The final meet of the First Regiment Athletic Association in Chicago found our men in good condition, with the result that we were successful. Deakin won first in the open forty-yard handicap and second in the academy forty-yard dash, with Hogenson first. In the relay race, Savage, French, Callan, Adams, and Delves ran as named, and crossed the finish line well ahead of the nearest competitor, Milwaukee Academy.

We next entered a four-man relay team in the meet given by the University of Chicago to select a team to represent the secondary schools of the West in the National Championship meet, to be held in Philadelphia. Our chances were injured on account of one man being unable to train for three weeks because of sprains. Callan, Savage, Adams, and Delves ran as named,*and covered our school with glory. The strong Hyde Park team was the only team able to beat us, and that with one of our fellows scarcely able to run his quarter. Hyde Park won the National Championship with ease at Philadelphia.
