



CUNNINGHAM HALL

3100 S. Michigan Avenue

Cunningham Hall, a nine-story reinforced concrete building, is named for James D. Cunningham, who has been chairman of the board of trustees of Illinois Tech since its establishment in 1940.

The building contains 56 living units, 32 of which are three-bedroom apartments. The exterior is identical with that of Carman and Bailey Halls.

The main floor is devoted to a lounge-type lobby and a glass-walled recreation area. In the basement are laundry facilities, a hobby room, and storage rooms.
