larger or smaller. Illusions are created in many ways; two objects of the same size placed on different backgrounds will seem to differ in size or contour. A square placed in a rectange parallel to the sides will appear to be a diamond if it is rotated in the same rectangle.

Inner Relationships

Each part of a design is dependent on all the other parts; no one element is as entity in itself. It acts upon and is acted upon by all the othere elements. Because this is true, no one part of the design can be planned separately but must be considered in conjunction with the rest of the work. The visual balance of many parts used together as a single unit depends to a very fine degree in the placement of the parts in relation to one another. Moving one will destroy the equilibruim so that other parts will need to be shifted in order to regain the balance. Variety of sizes and shapes can be unified through use of colors and textures that are related. Areas close in size become monotonous unless relieved by other elements that attract the eye. The eye is a very sensitive organ and becomes bored by too many repetitions; the designer can counteract eye firedness through inventing new contrast either in color, shape or size.
