The year's work has demonstrated clearly a number of facts :— 1. If Armour is to maintain its high basket-ball standing, more large men must be available. A team composed of small men, no matter how fast they may become, cannot hope to compete successfully with present day teams.

2. The entire school must contribute, and not leave one class ('06) to furnish with one exception, the whole term

furnish, with one exception, the whole team.

3. A good coach should be secured whose business is basket-ball and who knows his business.

Give us these three things, and next year's team will be a winner.
