

During the summer the institute offers a special session of six weeks length, for the purpose of allowing students who are deficient in certain studies, to make up the same, and also for affording an opportunity for teachers or special students to extend their knowledge along certain lines. Instruction is offered in any of the regular courses for which there are sufficient applicants. Circulars explaining the summer session in full may be obtained upon request.

The field work of the sophomore year in the Civil Engineering Department, is carried on in this summer session. This work is now required for graduation and is easily seen to have very beneficial results, as the students are better able to concentrate their minds upon some single subject which is important in their particular course. Last summer the camp was established near Waukazoo, Mich.

For the year 1906, the summer courses began upon June 25 and were closed upon August 3. Two hundred and twenty-one students attended these courses. Six foreign countries were represented by eight students and twenty-eight states of the Union were represented by two hundred and thirteen students. There were one hundred and forty-two students from the state of Illinois, while one hundred and nineteen of that number were from Chicago.
