



The chrysallis of the Armour Engineer was formulated in the minds of the professors and seniors who saw the need of such a publication in September of 1908. In January, 1909, under the management of Tracy W. Simpson as Editor-in-Chief and E. V. McKarahan as Business Manager the first volume was published. Since then two issues have been printed each year, one in January and one in May. As stated by its originators, "The Engineer is intended to be a record of the progress attained at Armour, and of the things her graduates

are doing." A fact which proves the increase of popularity and its worth to outsiders is shown by the number of times the Engineer is quoted in other Technical magazines. The Engineer presents treatises written by the professors and alumni of the Tech as well as those written by the undergraduates. The Staff consists of a senior Editor-in-Chief and a senior Business Manager; each one receiving his tuition for the work done on the book.
