

The Polemics was organized in the spring of 1913 as a means of filling a long-felt want at Armour, a society for literary discussion which, should be open to all members of the Institute. Incidental to practice in public speaking, parliamentary usage is taken up and each member is given a chance to preside at a meeting and to act as secretary.
