


Lieut. George A. Cormey was born at Waltham, Mass., on September 18, 1893. A graduate of Waltham high school, he attended Norwich University, Vt. From May 12 to August 15, 1917, he attended the Officers' Training Camp at Plattsburg Barracks, New York, and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Cavalry. He was a member of the "Iron Battalion" at Harvard University from August 19 to September 19, 1917. From September, 1917, to June 26, 1918, he was assigned to the 304th Infantry, Camp Devens, Mass. He was now ordered to Armour Institute to serve as an instructor in the S. A. T. C., where he remained until his discharge.



Lieutenant Wm. H. Lautz was commissioned a Second Lieutenant at Fort Sheridan, September 16, 1918. He was assigned to the S. A. T. C. at Armour Institute where he served in the capacity of adjutant. In civilian life he is the Asst. Prof. of Architecture at Armour, to which duties he returned after his discharge.
