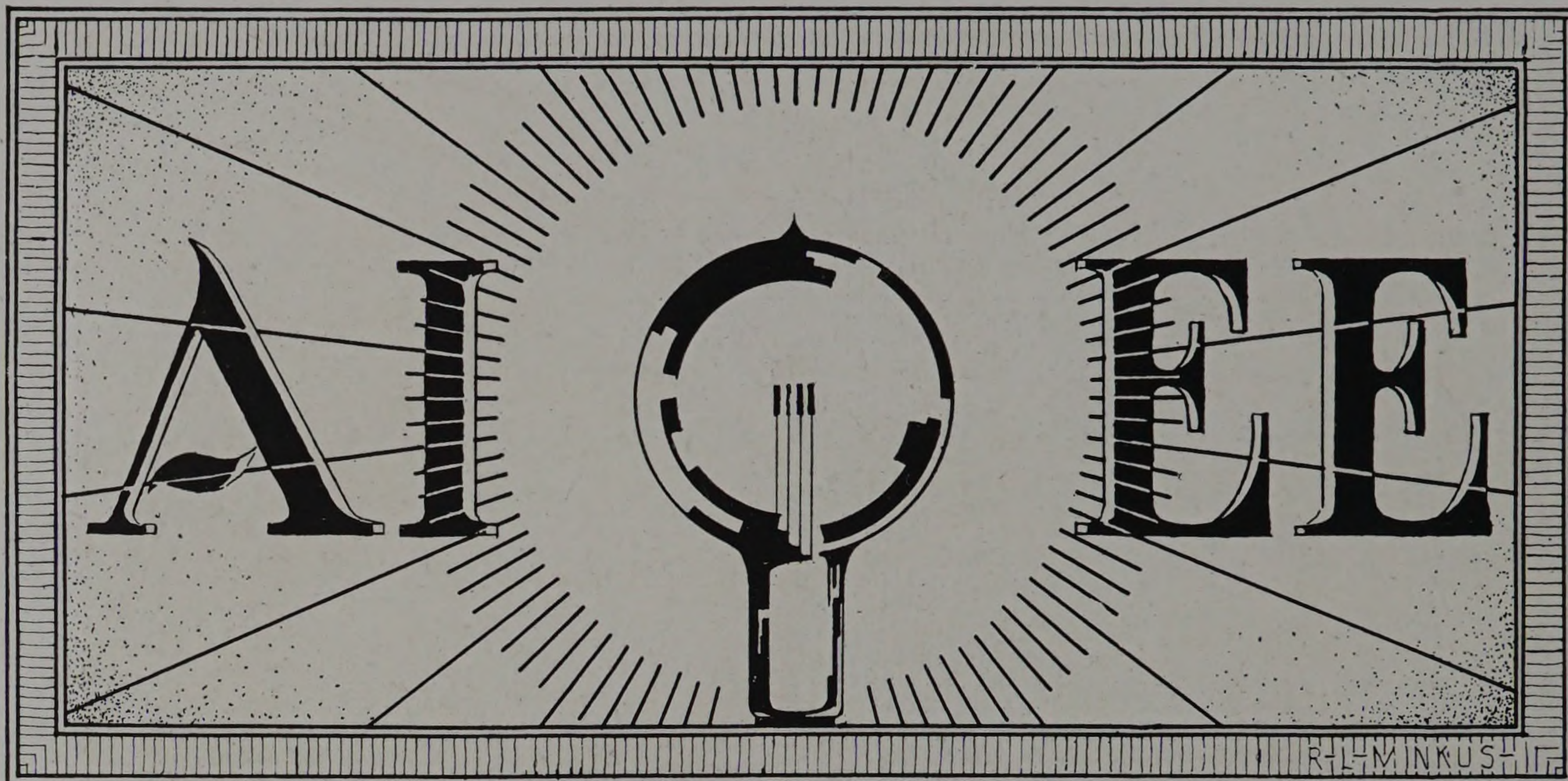




Armour Institute of Technology

The work of the Armour Institute of Technology Branch of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers has been greatly hampered this year due to the interference of the military organization at the school. Since demobilization three meetings have been held, and an effort has been made to increase the activities of the Branch.

The chief aim of the Branch this spring has been to increase the interest of the engineering students of the Electrical Department in the work of the parent organization; and to introduce to them the broader aspects of the profession by bringing prominent speakers before them. The Branch has also made use of the illustrated lecture service which is maintained by the Publication Bureau of the General Electric Company.

The following meetings have been held:

October 3, 1918. A business meeting at which the officers were elected.

January 13, 1919. A business meeting at which plans for the work of the Branch were formulated.

February 20, 1919. Mr. Chas. H. Jones, "Automatic Substations."

March 13, 1919. This was a joint meeting of the Branch and the A. S. M. E. "The Message of the Curtiss Steam Turbine", an illustrated lecture from the General Electric Company was read by the Secretary.
