The Honor "A" Society was organized in the spring of 1914 by the active athletes of Armour. This sounded like a death knell for the "A" Society, as no more eligible members could be taken in until athletics were again revived. As each succeeding class graduated, the active membership of the society decreased until there are only three members now in school.

With the bright prospects of again having Tech teams next year, the society will resume its activities, and the block "A" will again be worn by the new "A" men.
