under normal school conditions, presenting a personal side of the situation which brings out the good points of all the persons concerned, magnifying them for analysis, and minimizing the discordant points by producing an understanding of one another and by sinking them in the spirit of mutual helpfulness which pervades the whole atmosphere; it helps to produce a type of college man experienced in matters outside of the heart of civilization, strong, virile and eager to accomplish, and instills in him an appreciation of nature and the great outdoors. Indeed it is an attainment and an innovation in instruction of which our college may be justly proud.

Those in evidence at meal times were Professors Phillips and Penn, without whose perennial attendance the camp would be considered by all as a dismal affair, Professor Armstrong who made his debut, as it were, and many times made us appreciate how fortunate we were to have happened upon a year when we might be given the added advantage of his experience in our guidance, and the following reckless invaders of the field of Civil Engineering knowledge:
