The Armour Institute of Technology Branch of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers was installed February 26, 1903, by the national organization. The purpose of the branch is to give the student of electrical engineering an opportunity to hear and to meet men who are prominent in the profession, and to enable him to discuss, or even prepare, papers upon subjects of a technical or electrical nature.

Through the "Journal" the members obtain information concerning the interesting papers given by the members of the national organization, in addition to the description of everything recent in the electrical science, both in theory and in practice.
