Delta of Pi Tau Sigma

Pi Tau Sigma, the national Honorary Mechanical Engineering Fraternity, was organized in 1915 in order to establish a closer bond of fellowship mutually benefiting those students of mechanical engineering who have maintained a high grade of scholarship and to foster a spirit of liberal culture in the engineering students of the institutions in which its chapters are located. The worthiness of a candidate for Pi Tau Sigma is determined not alone by scholastic standing but also by the qualities of character, loyalty, personality, leadership and college activity.

Students are elected to Pi Tau Sigma from the upper half of the senior class and the upper quarter of the junior class in the fall. They are also elected from the upper third of the junior class in the spring of each year.

A chapter may also confer a key upon technical graduates actively engaged in the engineering profession. Honorary membership may also be conferred upon full associate or assistant professors in the Mechanical Engineering Department. Only last spring, Pi Tau Sigma had the great pleasure of initiating Prof. J. C. Peebles as an honorary member.

Pi Tau Sigma now boasts of eight active chapters of which Delta chapter is the fifth.
