VERNON A. STURM

The Honor "A" Society is one of the oldest organizations at Armour, having been founded in the spring of 1914. Originally it was the governing body of athletics at Armour as well as a society to promote athletics and bind the men together. However, in 1923 the Armour Tech Athletic Association was organized and took over the duties of regulating school athletics. To bring a closer union between the athlete, student, coach and alumnus, the members of the society wear small gold "A" watch-charms.

This year the society sponsored the first Armour Athletic Alumni Reunion, on December 6, 1928 at the Auto Grill immediately after the Alumni-Varsity Basketball game. The banquet was well attended by Honor "A" men from various parts of the country as well as from Chicago.
