


The basketball team during the season 1928-29, while not exceptional as a team, showed some improvement over the previous year when the team won four out of the nineteen games played. This year five games were won against eleven lost. Four letter men, some substitutes and several freshmen were what

Coach Krafft, who succeeded Coach Romney, cut the squad quickly, with an eye for weight, till approximately fifteen remained. However, his final choices were handicapped by a lack of size and weight, a thing that he had foreseen but which was inevitable.
