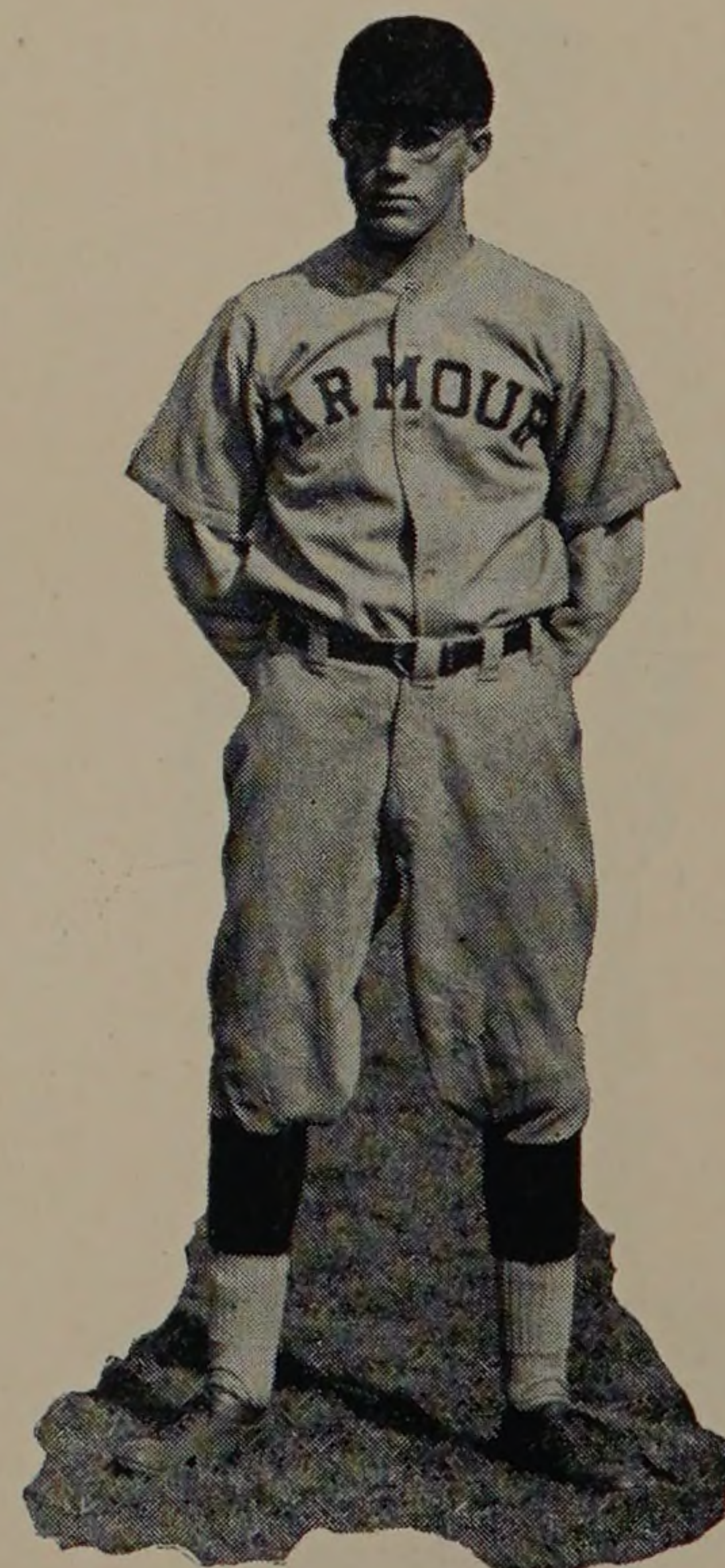
has not defeated Armour in six years of baseball competition.
