Armour won six first and six second places out of a possible ten. Sademan was high point man by winning first places in both the mile and two mile runs. A clean sweep was scored by Tech in the quarter mile run when Sturm, Fox, Hirsch and Helmick finished in that order.

Kara won first place in the fifty yard low hurdles beside placing third in the shot put, which was won by Captain Don Paul with a throw of 46 feet. Iverson won the half mile run and Timmermans came in third.

Tech tracksters rose to greater heights than ever before when they defeated 140 athletes representing 15 colleges competing in the second annual Armour Tech Invitational Indoor Track meet held

at Bartlett Gymnasium on March 29. The table of points follows: Armour 61½; Chicago B 31; Loyola 30; Chicago Normal 26½; Crane 24½; Lake Forest 24; Mooseheart 22; Wheaton 16; Marquette 10; Butler 10; Beloit 9½.

Captain Don Paul was the out-


standing star of the meet when he heaved the 16 pound shot 46 feet 9 inches. This throw tied the Bartlett Gymnasium record held by Weaver of Chicago. On the night before the Invitational meet Paul took first place in the shot put at the Central A. A. U. indoor championships with a throw of 45 feet 11¼ inches.

Sturm tied Freudenthal of Chicago in the quarter mile dash which was run in two heats; both men ran the distance in 54.4 seconds.

Tech won the meet by coping two first places and a majority of the third and fourth places.

Sademan won a second place in the mile run, being nosed out on the final lap by the Wheaton flash, Hess.

A summary of results of the invitational meet indicated the following for Tech: James, second, two mile run; Sademan, third, two mile run; Kara, third, high hurdles; Iverson, third, half mile run; Jens, fourth, 50 yard dash; Fox, fourth, quarter mile run.
