Western State Normal upset Armour for the second time this year by the large score of 60-28. Although the victors were leading by only six points at the start of the third quarter, they ran wild thereafter, sinking baskets from every angle. Ten Techmen made the trip to Michigan.

St. Mary's College was defeated, 27-22, before two thousand spectators at Orchard Lake, Michigan, for Tech's fifth victory of the 1931 season. Rossing starred by scoring 15 of the victor's 27 points.

Augustana's earlier 34-30 victory was avenged on Friday, February 13, when Armour defeated them by a 36-28 score. Both teams played a fast snappy game with excel-

lent quick passes. Robin and Rossing led the scoring with 21 points between them.

Coach Krafft's basketeters again avenged a previous defeat, when they outscored "Y" College, 37-24. The visitors were hopelessly outplayed and outscored during the first half, being

on the short end of a 20-6 score. Beemsterboer, Rossing, and Robin, each netted Armour nine points.

Armour Tech climaxed its 1930-31 basketball season with a 33-26 victory over Chi-

cago Tech at the De La Salle gymnasium for its fourth consecutive


victory. This game marked the final appearance of Captain Robin, Ott, O'Connor, Rutkowski, and Setterberg, who will graduate during the coming year. The black and yellow men were outscored until the final six minutes of the game, when they forged to the fore on shots by Ott and Omiecinski.

The 1931 season was not without its serious mishaps. Miran and Gustafson, two stellar guards of the season, were lost during the earlier part due to illness and ineligibility.


