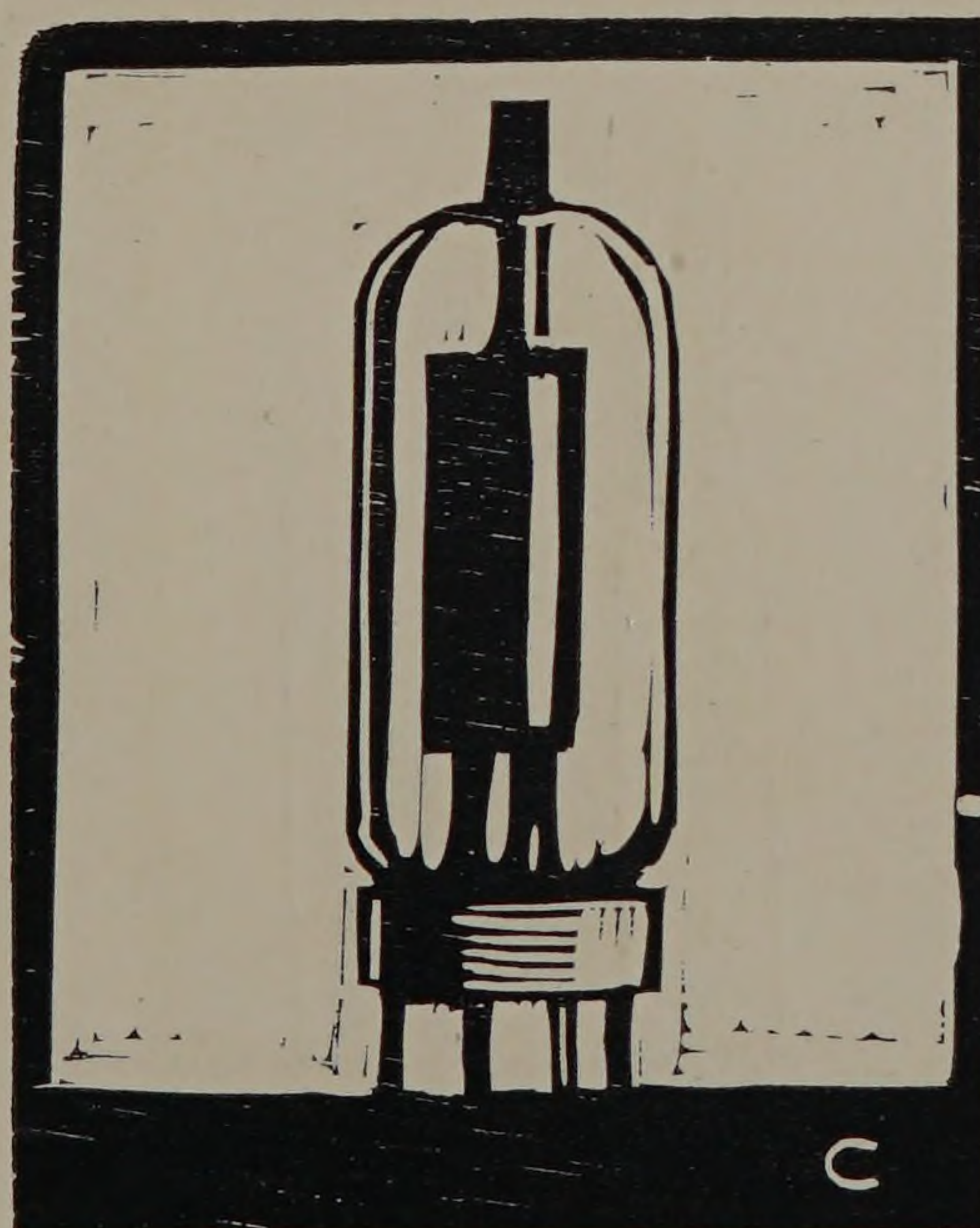

The purpose of the Armour Radio Association is to provide for those interested in radio communication an opportunity to foster that interest. The Armour Radio Association was formed in 1922 when Armour Institute became the re-

cipient of a complete broadcasting station, WPAD. Students, who were radio operators licensed by the Federal government, rebuilt the apparatus to meet their special needs and obtained the official call letters, W9NV. Since that time, the station, remodeled to keep abreast with the rapid advancement in radio, has been in constant use. It has been managed by licensed operators, all of whom own private transmitters.
