It was on October 28, 1904, that Eta Kappa Nu was organized by ten progressive students in the department of electrical engineering at the University of Illinois. Realizing the benefit to be derived from such an organization and the necessity for binding together the outstanding members of each class, these students made the necessary steps for its organization.

In 1909 a few students of Electrical Engineering at Armour Institute petitioned Eta Kappa Nu. On May 24, 1909, Delta chapter was chartered. These students realized fully the benefits to be derived from closer association with graduate students and with the students of other engineering colleges interested in their line of work. The society now includes 22 active chapters and nine alumni chapters.

The major requirement for candidacy to Eta Kappa Nu is scholarship. The standard of scholarship is defined in its broadest sense. It is taken to mean ability to lead and ability to use knowledge with common sense.
