In 1909 the leaders of architecture at the University of Illinois organized a group called the Scarab fraternity. It had no intention of becoming a national organization when founded. An architectural fraternity was organized at Armour in 1900. It was known as Alpha Delta Tau. This organization continued until 1915, when it was admitted, after petitioning, as Edfou Temple of Scarab Fraternity. There are now thirteen temples in the nation-wide organization.

Scarab secures through association the advantages of a refined culture; it stimulates interest in architecture and the allied arts and promotes friendly competition among the students and schools of architecture, and creates a lasting spirit of fellowship and cooperation within the fraternity.

Election to membership is based on ability, scholarship and character. It has always kept its membership comparatively small.
